the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals. Judge Pickering is a staunch opponent  
of legal abortion and civil rights. He should not be confirmed.

Pickering is against women???s rights. He served as a State Senator from  
1972-1980; during that time he voted in favor of a convention to propose a  
constitutional amendment to ban abortion, and he voted against state  
funding for family planning groups. In 1976, Judge Pickering chaired the  
subcommittee of the National Republican Party that approved a plank  
calling for an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to make abortion

illegal. Pickering also opposed the Equal Rights Amendment.

Judge Pickering's history on civil rights issues is alarming. In 1959, he wrote a law review article arguing that a Mississippi statute criminalizing interracial marriage should be amended so that it would be more enforceable. Soon after the publication of that article, the statute was amended in the manner Pickering suggested. As a State Senator, Pickering regularly voted against any change in the state election process that would increase the ability of African Americans to be elected officials. He also voted in favor of funding for the notorious Mississippi Sovereignty Committee, a secretive agency that investigated civil rights workers in the 1960s and 1970s. As a district court judge, he has criticized remedies provided by the Voting Rights Act to redress discrimination against African American voters.

If confirmed, Judge Pickering will serve on the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals--already one of the most conservative courts of appeals in the country. The Fifth Circuit hears appeals from Texas, Louisiana, and Mississippi; many elected officials in these states are strongly anti-abortion and anti-civil rights. If Judge Pickering is confirmed, women's rights and the rights of Latinos and African Americans will suffer.

By opposing this nomination, we will send a message to the President that he must nominate candidates who support women's rights and civil rights.
