> Ruling on Richard Reid, "The Shoe Bomber"  
>  
> Ruling by Judge William Young  
> U.S. District Court Judge William Young made the following statement  
> in sentencing "shoe bomber" Richard Reid to prison. It is  
> noteworthy, and deserves to be remembered far longer than he  
> predicts. I commend it to you and to anyone you might wish to  
> forward it to.  
>  
> January 30, 2003 United States vs. Reid. Judge Young:  
> Mr. Richard C. Reid hearken now to the sentence the Court imposes  
> upon you.  
>  
> On counts 1, 5 and 6 the Court sentences you to life in prison in  
> the custody of the United States Attorney General.  
>  
> On counts 2, 3, 4 and 7, the Court sentences you to 20 years in  
> prison on each count, the sentence on each count to run consecutive  
> with the other. That's 80 years.  
>  
> On count 8 the Court sentences you to the mandatory 30 years  
> consecutive to the 80 years just imposed. The Court imposes upon you  
> each of the eight counts a fine of \$250,000 for the aggregate fine  
> of \$2 million.  
>  
> The Court accepts the government's recommendation with respect to  
> restitution and orders restitution in the amount of \$298.17 to Andre  
> Bousquet and \$5,784 to American Airlines.  
>  
> The Court imposes upon you the \$800 special assessment.  
>  
> The Court imposes upon you five years supervised release simply  
> because the law requires it. But the life sentences are real life  
> sentences so I need go no further. This is the sentence that is  
> provided for by our statutes. It is a fair and just sentence. It is a  
> righteous sentence. Let me explain this to you.  
> We are not afraid of any of your terrorist co-conspirators, Mr.  
> Reid. We are Americans. We have been through the fire before. There  
> is all too much war talk here. And I say that to everyone with the  
> utmost respect.  
> Here in this court, where we deal with individuals as individuals,  
> and care for individuals as individuals, as human beings we reach  
> out for justice, you are not an enemy combatant. You are a  
> terrorist. You are not a soldier in any war. You are a terrorist. To  
> give you that reference, to call you a soldier gives you far too  
> much stature. Whether it is the officers of government who do it or  
> your attorney who does it, or that happens to be your view, you are  
> a terrorist. And we do not negotiate with terrorists.  
> We do not treat with terrorists. We do not sign documents with  
> terrorists.  
> We hunt them down one by one and bring them to justice. So war talk  
> is way out of line in this court. You are a big fellow. But you are  
> not that big.  
> You're no warrior. I know warriors. You are a terrorist. A species



> of criminal guilty of multiple attempted murders. In a very real  
> sense Trooper Santiago had it right when you first were taken off  
> that plane and into custody and you wondered where the press and  
> where the TV crews were and he said you're no big deal. You're no  
> big deal. What your  
> counsel, what your able counsel and what the equally able United  
> States attorneys have grappled with and what I have as honestly as I  
> know how tried to grapple with, is why you did something so  
> horrific. What was it that led you here to this courtroom today? I  
> have listened respectfully to what you have to say. And I ask you to  
> search your heart and ask yourself what sort of unfathomable hate  
> led you to do what you are guilty and  
> admit you are guilty of doing. And I have an answer for you. It may  
> not satisfy you. But as I search this entire record it comes as  
> close to understanding as I know. It seems to me you hate the one  
> thing that is most precious.  
> You hate our freedom. Our individual freedom. Our individual freedom  
> to live as we choose to come and go as we choose, to believe or not  
> believe as we individually choose.  
>  
> Here, in this society, the very winds carry freedom. They carry it  
> everywhere from sea to shining sea. It is because we prize  
> individual freedom so much that you are here in this beautiful  
> courtroom. So that everyone can see, truly see that justice is  
> administered fairly, individually, and discretely. It is for  
> freedom's sake that your lawyers are striving  
> so vigorously on your behalf and have filed appeals, will go on in  
> their, their representation of you before other judges. We are about  
> it.  
> Because we all know that the way we treat you, Mr. Reid, is the  
> measure  
> of our own liberties. Make no mistake though. It is yet true that we  
> will bear any burden, pay any price, to preserve our freedoms. Look  
> around this courtroom.  
> Mark it well. The world is not going to long remember what you or I  
> say here.  
> Day after tomorrow it will be forgotten. But this, however, will  
> long endure.  
> Here in this courtroom and courtrooms all across America, the  
> American  
> people will gather to see that justice individual justice, justice,  
> not war,  
> individual justice is in fact being done.  
>  
> The very President of the United States through his officers will  
> have to come into courtrooms and lay out evidence on which specific  
> matters can be judged, and juries of citizens will gather to sit and  
> judge that evidence democratically, to mold and shape and refine our  
> sense of justice.  
>  
> See that flag, Mr. Reid? That's the flag of the United States of  
> America. That flag will fly there long after this is all forgotten.  
> That flag stands for freedom. You know it always will.  
>  
> Custody Mr. Officer. Stand him down.  
>

> How much of this Judge's comments did you hear on our TV sets?  
>  
> Please pass this around.  
>  
> Everyone needs to hear what the judge had to say.
