And you relied on a strong crop of young pitchers – Brad Penny [present], the D-Train [not present], and a Texan who saved his best pitching for the World Series: Josh Beckett [present].
- To win the World Series, every member of this team set high standards on the diamond – and now that you’re champs, you have a responsibility to meet those standards away from the field as well. Millions of kids in America grow up wanting to play like the Florida Marlins, and they are watching the way you conduct yourselves all the time. It’s important for you, and for all professional athletes, to set the right example for children in this country.
- I have confidence that you will uphold your duties as champions, because I have seen your character in the dedication to your community you have already shown:
 - The Marlins management contributes to Florida’s “Adopt-A-Classroom” program, which helps local teachers purchase extra supplies to make learning more fun for students. The Marlins are also continuing the strong tradition of big leaguers supporting youth baseball – including through the Josh Beckett Youth Baseball tournament, which will be played for the fifth time this year.
 - For more than two years, A.J. Burnett [present] has worked with the Florida Division of the Center for Missing and Exploited Children. He volunteers his time to tape ads and host events that show children how to be safer and publicize information about abducted children. A.J.’s work is getting results: More than 30 children featured on his “Play It Safe” days at Marlins games have been rescued.

- Juan Pierre [present] organized “Pierre’s Pack” to introduce underprivileged children to the game of baseball. Every month he treats a group of kids to box seats, tee-shirts, and a bus to Pro Player Stadium to watch a Marlins game.
- I appreciate the good and hopeful work you are doing in your communities, and I respect your excellence on the field. You are bringing thrills to your fans, and inspiration to young people everywhere. Congratulations on being World Series champs, and good luck this season.
