residential Libraries are not libraries in the usual sense. They are archives and museums, preserving the written record and physical history of our presidents, while providing special programs and exhibits that serve their communities. These libraries, described by President Reagan as "classrooms of Democracy," belong to the American people.

Beginning a tradition that continues to this day, President Franklin D. Roosevelt raised private funds and built a library, which he gave to the U.S. Government for operation through the National Archives. In 1955, this process became law when the U.S. Congress passed the Presidential Libraries Act.

The American Presidency is part of a unique heritage that is yours to explore. Through archives, museums, and special programs, Presidential Libraries preserve the documents and artifacts of our Presidents and provide insight into the times in which these Presidents lived and served the nation.





## Parking



The Museum employs immersive interactive features that tell the story of our nation and our world in an extraordinary time. The exhibition examines the September 11, 2001 attacks and the response of the President and the country in the aftermath. The Decision Points Theater takes visitors inside the Presidential decision-making process through key events of the Bush Administration. A full-size reproduction of the Oval Office, the Texas Rose Garden, and the "Life in the White House" exhibits allow visitors to experience the public and private areas of the First Family's home.

The Museum's temporary exhibition galleries offer changing exhibits on a regular basis, complementing the permanent exhibit and illustrating themes and subjects relevant to the George W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum.
