What is yet to happen? Is it over? What does this mean?

September 11, 2001 is a day in infamy—a day that will change the world

The church's language about evil sometimes seems for many far away from their experience of life; and now is the only language for what has happened

Our loss extends to those who grieve

To those who are still trying to reach loved ones

To children whose world has been shattered;

To those who have lived with illusions of safety and security that cannot endure sadness -

People want to be with loved ones; we are drawn together; but as believing people we are drawn to this place

The 23rd Psalm - places it was prayed

- -- saw Israel through the destruction and burning of their homes as they were sent into exile.
- --it gave them courage to start again when they were allowed to return to a desolate land and build again
 - -- It helped them through the heartache of the defilement of the Temple
 - --it helped them in the valleys

it has been prayed in foxholes and at deathbeds; it has been prayed by those who were very afraid and those who knew where to turn with their fears

there is a monastery - which I saw in Israel

- --located in the valley of the shadow of death
- --right at the heart of the most desolate place in the Judean wilderness
- -- it is a testament, a statement of faith
- --God will not abandon us or forsake us even in that valley
- --I took a picture of that monastery for my sister who had just lost her son we have a hope, a rock, a fortress ... in Jesus Christ

Christian faith doesn't suggest that life is easy. The empty cross, a symbol of victory, is also a reminder of evil and violence. There are valleys, some of them dramatic and some of them less so. We do need a shepherd in the valleys. And we are not simply promised safe journey. We are promised a banquet.

It is one thing to live bravely underestimating the danger. It is another fully to understand the dangers and to live with the confidence of faith in the promises of him who promised never to leave us or forsake us.
