Working families face new challenges in today's economy, and no one understands that more than working women. Whether they work inside the home, outside the home, or both – they need a government that takes their side.

Most important, you need a government, and a President, who understands that the most solemn obligation of our government is to protect you and your children. The sacrifices being made today will make the world safer for our children and grandchildren. I've made some difficult decisions as your President...the toughest was on Iraq.

On all these issues that are so important to women, my opponent has taken the side of government - he has not giving more control to women. He took the side of government when in it came to taxes...opposing increasing the child tax credit and reducing the marriage penalty. He took the side of government and trial lawyers...opposing medical liability reform.
