I. PURPOSE

To assist other volunteers in assembling Operation USO Care Packages and to highlight what Americans can do to show their support for our military.

II. BACKGROUND

Following September 11th and the anthrax threat, the Department of Defense suspended its practice of forwarding mail addressed to “any service member.” Operation USO Care Package was created to provide a safe and secure way for the public to show their support for our men and women in uniform.

For a \$25 dollar donation, Americans can sponsor a care package for a service member who is either en route to an overseas assignment or already deployed. For security reasons, the packages are assembled on a military base by volunteers. Each Operation USO Care Package contains, at a minimum, a 100-minute international calling card, a disposable camera, toiletries, sunscreen, playing cards, and a message of support from a Care Package sponsor. Over 480,000 care packages have been assembled and distributed as of December 2004.

During today’s event, you and Mrs. Bush will be working alongside regular volunteers, including three soldiers receiving treatment at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. The goal for today’s event is to assemble 5,000 care packages.

The USO is a Congressionally-chartered non-profit corporation whose mission is to provide morale, welfare, and recreation-type services to military personnel. The USO operates 125 centers, including centers in Kuwait and Qatar, and will open a center in Afghanistan in time for this year’s Super Bowl. Each President has traditionally served as the Honorary Chairman of the USO.

Fort Belvoir has donated space and assistance to Operation USO Care Package since August 2004. The program was previously housed at Fort Meade in Maryland.

BIOGRAPHIES OF ELAINE BOOTH ROGERS AND CHERYL LAAKER HALL

Elaine Booth Rogers, President, USO of Metropolitan Washington (will greet and introduce you)

- The USO of Metropolitan Washington (USO-Metro) hired Elaine Booth Rogers in 1976 as its program director, and she has served as its president since 1977.
- Under Ms. Rogers' direction, USO-Metro has become the largest USO in the world with ten service locations providing vital human services, especially for the junior enlisted military with the greatest economic needs. She has overseen the creation of the Emergency Housing Program, which provides temporary housing at no cost to military families in severe financial or medical crises. Initially, there were two apartment units, and today there are 26 units. Among the other programs established under her direction are quarterly job fairs, visits to military hospitals, holiday programs, and the distribution of car seats for infants.
- Ms. Rogers is a native of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, and she received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1974 from Catawba College in Salisbury, North Carolina. Ms. Rogers is engaged.

Cheryl Laaker [LAY-ker] Hall, Director, Operation USO Care Package (will greet you)

- Ms. Laaker Hall has held the position of Director of Operation USO Care Package since December 2003. As the Director of Operation USO Care Package, Ms. Laaker Hall oversees the production and distribution of care packages for troops serving in the war against terror. During her tenure, more than 300,000 care packages have been sent. She oversees a pool of 3,000 volunteers who have given over 18,000 hours of service to make the program operate.
- A native of Quincy, Illinois, Ms. Laaker Hall has held two posts with the Girl Scouts of the United States of America. Most recently, she managed the largest sale of Girl Scout Cookies and other product sales conducted annually by the Girl Scout Council of the Nation's Capital in Washington, D.C. She started her career in the non-profit sector in 1993 with the March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation, where she received national recognition for a statewide campaign to bring awareness and resources to pregnant women in rural areas affected by the Midwestern floods.
- Ms. Laaker Hall is a graduate of Northeast Missouri State University (now Truman State University) in Kirksville, Missouri. She is married to [b(3) 10 USC 130b] United States Coast Guard, and lives in Bristow, Virginia.
