Dear President Bush:

Recently, the House Committee on Energy and Commerce circulated a draft bill that would reauthorize the National Institutes of Health (NIH). As currently written, this bill would have a profound and lasting effect on all disease research supported by the various Institutes and Centers within the NIH. The goal of improving the coordination and effectiveness of research activities supported by the NIH is admirable; however, it is important to carefully consider the potential unintended consequences that this bill may have on current and future advances in biomedical science that will lead to the prevention, early detection, and improved treatment of cancer and other diseases afflicting millions of Americans—and millions more around the world.

Cancer has long been recognized as a significant health problem. It is the disease most feared by Americans and as the population ages, is a growing challenge. As a result of scientific research, we have learned that cancer is actually a collection of hundreds of different diseases, each of which has its own etiology, pathogenesis, and life history. The common features of uncontrolled growth and potential for metastasis, even among cancers arising in a single organ site, may be the result of many different genetic and epigenetic abnormalities in both the cancer cells and surrounding tissues. Thus, the common endpoint of malignancy may require many different approaches for prevention, detection, and treatment. This is one of the major reasons why cancer has been an intractable problem, more difficult to solve than that of putting people on the moon.

The President's Cancer Panel (PCP) is an independent, presidentially appointed advisory panel charged with monitoring the development and execution of the National Cancer Program (NCP) and reporting its findings directly to the President and Congress. Given that the PCP's mission is to report on impediments or blockages in the execution of the NCP, we would like to highlight the potential impact that the draft reauthorization language could have on the ability of the PCP to function and on the progress of cancer research if the proposed bill is enacted into law.

The PCP is directly impacted by the current draft legislation to reauthorize the NIH. In an effort to consolidate the reporting requirements for the NIH, section 403(b)(1)(G), lines 20–21 on page 25 of the draft bill, strike the last sentence of 42 U.S.C. §415(b). The language to be stricken states:

The Panel shall submit to the President periodic progress reports on the National Cancer Program and shall submit to the President, the Secretary, and the Congress an annual evaluation of the efficacy of the Program and suggestions for improvements, and shall submit such other reports as the President shall direct.

Although improved organization of NIH reporting requirements is a reasonable goal, it is important to nace that the PCP is not officially part of the National Cancer Institute (NCI) or the NIH. An integral part of the national of the PCP is to provide an annual evaluation to the President, the Secretary, and Congress on the efficacy of the National Cancer Program. There is a fundamental difference between the NCI and the National Cancer Program: NCI is only part of the National Cancer Program; the National Cancer Program encompasses a number of other Federal agencies (such as CDC, FDA, HRSA, AHRQ, CMS, VA) as well as an enormous network of other public and private entities around the United States, including countless community hospitals (where the vast majority of cancer patients are treated, as opposed to the small percentage treated in NCIdesignated Cancer Centers), universities, private industry, professional scientific and research organizations, and the advocacy community. The annual report released by the PCP each year is not an NCI report; it is far broader and encompasses issues in the overarching National Cancer Program that affect far more than just the NCI. It is the only reporting mechanism within the Federal Government that outlines the barriers to the execution of the National Cancer Program-as identified by the PCP-to be addressed and overcome.

In addition, we believe that strategic planning, priority setting, and control of resources for activities and programs directly related to the NCI mission must remain in the hands of the NCI Director. NCI commits resources for multiyear research projects, including Specialized Programs of Research Excellence and NCI-designated Cancer Centers, supporting cancer research programs across the country. In order to continue to plan for the future and to aggressively incorporate the needs of the research community into NCI's priority setting, the NCI Director must retain control over the resources allocated to the NCI.

There is an inherent risk in increasing the NIH Director's transfer authority. The greater the NIH Director's transfer authority, the more uncertainty the NCI has in the planning process, thereby diminishing NCI's leadership and ability to support the cancer community. Current budget realities have NCI constantly examining its programs and appraising how best to utilize its resources. Any increase in the NIH Director's transfer authority would make these tasks that much more daunting.

In spite of the considerable progress made in curing certain types of cancer, cancer remains a devastating disease for many individuals. No one visiting a cancer treatment facility can possibly miss the fear and anguish generated by a diagnosis of cancer: fear of the treatment, fear that there is no treatment, fear of suffering a slow and painful death, fear of the consequences for family members and other loved ones, and fear of the economic burdens of cancer treatment. Even among those fortunate enough to survive cancer treatment, there remains the fear of recurrence or the development of new cancers or late medical effects of the cancer therapy. Our inability to predict the outcome of cancer and cancer therapy for most individuals adds a huge degree of uncertainty to the lives of cancer survivors and, often, a devastating financial burden as well. The sheer magnitude of this problem, exacerbated by the aging of the population, remains a daunting challenge, even in the face of new avenues for progress.

Diminishing the NCI's authority and autonomy does a disservice and sends the wrong message to all people affected by cancer—at precisely the time when continued momentum is crucial to realizing the goal of reducing the burden of cancer. Progress is being made toward this goal, based largely on advances derived from previous investments in the National Cancer Program. Centralized control does not typically improve the ability of an organization to recruit top research talent in a timely manner or to promote creativity and flexibility in carrying out a research agenda. For these reasons, we believe that increasing the authority of the NIH at the expense of the NCI would impede progress and seriously undermine the National Cancer Program.

The PCP will be meeting in Washington, DC, August 25–26, 2005. We would welcome the opportunity to further discuss our concerns with you either in person or by phone.

Joanne Burri says her son thought of his time in the Army as an adventure, much the same as his trip to Uruguay several years ago as an exchange student.

"He was an adventurous boy. He wanted to see the world," she said of Spc. Eric T. Burri, a Wyoming native who was assigned to the 623rd Quartermaster Co., 1st Corps Support Command at Fort Bragg, N.C.

Two soldiers were waiting to speak with Joanne Burri when she arrived home late Tuesday from her custodial job at Kelloggsville High School. They told her that a primitive roadside bomb in Baghdad had exploded near her 21-year-old son's vehicle, killing him.

"I just lost it," she told The Grand Rapids Press for a Friday story.

As hard as his loss hit her and her husband, **John**, **Burri** said she will not second-guess their son's decision to join the Army the year he graduated from Kelloggsville High.


When Eric Burri came home a few weeks ago to attend a relative's funeral, he also touched base with some of his high school friends. One of his favorite teachers, J.D. Gonzales, said he was pleased to see him standing in the hallway, talking with students.

"We got the e-mail (death notification), and I had to let the kids know who he was, and the good thing was I could tell them about Eric," said Gonzales, who teaches government. "He ... always had an opinion and was always optimistic, and I respected him for that. He was a good kid."

Flags at the school were lowered to half-staff as word of his death spread.

Woody Watson, a close family friend, said Burri loved to travel, learn languages and meet people.

"We're sad. We're hurt," Watson told The Detroit News. "He was brave to go and fight for freedom - not



only for his country, but for others around the world."

While overseas, Burri leaned on his trust in God, Watson said.

In an e-mail to his family, he wrote: "I know that all of you will keep me in your prayers and thoughts and also God will be watching my back."

Burri had been looking forward to returning from his tour of duty in Iraq, said another family friend, Bruce Sova.

"He wanted to get back, get it done, because he was due to come back in October," Sova told the Detroit Free Press. "He just wanted to start his life."

Burri was the 53rd member of the U.S. armed forces with known Michigan ties to be killed in Iraq.

He was the second soldier from the Grand Rapids suburb of Wyoming to die in Iraq the past year. Pfc. Nicholas Blodgett, 21, was killed July 21 when his patrol vehicle hit an explosive device in Abdalluyah.






