I. PURPOSE

To deliver remarks at the National Association of State Catholic Conference Directors 2003 Winter Meeting in Washington D.C.

II. BACKGROUND

The National Association of State Catholic Conference Directors (NASCCD) is an association of the Executive Directors of the State Catholic Conferences, organized in 1968 to facilitate and encourage the exchange of information among its members pertaining to the activities, programs, and organization of the Conferences.

The NASCCD works closely with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) which is an assembly of the hierarchy of the United States and the U.S. Virgin Islands who jointly exercise certain pastoral functions on behalf of the Christian faithful of the United States. The purpose of the Conference is to promote the greater good which the Church offers humankind, especially through forms and programs of the apostolate fittingly adapted to the circumstances of time and place.

A State Catholic Conference is a Church agency representing the dioceses within a state in order to provide for the coordination of the public policy concerns of the Church. State Conference of the Church communicates with state governments, other Church Agencies, non-Catholic churches, and secular agencies. Bishops, priests, religious, and lay persons are involved in the work of the State Conferences.

Similar to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, the state conferences are concerned about abortion (includes stem cell & embryo research), Church & State, criminal justice, the death penalty, education, euthanasia, environment, family, gambling, health care, housing, inter-religious affairs, gay marriage, poverty, social welfare, economic justice, racial justice, charitable tax credits.

Dear Mr. Rove:

In today's Wall Street Journal there is a piece regarding the work of President Bush's Council on Bioethics and its proposed recommendations to the way the United States regulates assisted reproduction. On behalf of Family Research Council I would like to thank the President for the work of Dr. Leon Kass and the Council's effort to implement the President's commitment to recognize the sacredness of life.

According to the article, the Council has drafted a document recommending policies that recognize the moral status of an embryo as a human being. We are encouraged that Dr. Kass has brought principles that reflect the President's to the work of the Council. We also understand that many of the principles espoused by Dr. Kass are considered controversial by some in the biotech community that would prefer to treat human life as a commodity to be bought and sold for a corporate profit. Consequently, the Council may feel pressured to accommodate opposing philosophies. We ask you to support the Council's initial draft of *U.S. Public Policy and the Biotechnologies that Touch the Beginnings of Human Life*. The document in its draft form reflects the President's call to protect human life and any effort to revise the document to accommodate competing philosophies would threaten the integrity of the Council's work.

On behalf of the thousands of families represented by Family Research Council we hope the President will offer his support to the leadership of Dr. Kass and his work with the President's Council on Bioethics. The area of bioethics is of critical concern to the future of our culture so we are hopeful that the work of the Council will reflect principles of sound ethics and offer needed guidance in a field that is too often driven by economics.

Dear Mr. President:

We are writing because of our deep concern about the U.S.-Australia Free Trade Agreement (FTA) that the U.S. Trade Representative's Office is currently negotiating. This agreement poses a dire threat to America's dairy industry, and consequently, to rural America as a whole. In the name of rural vitality, America's long tradition of encouraging family farms and homeland security concerns, we ask that you not include dairy in this agreement.

Upstate Farms Cooperative, Inc. is a dairy cooperative with over 300 dairy farm family members in Western New York. We operate three dairy plants with over 500 employees, to market more than a billion pounds of milk each year.


We have been supportive of all of your Administration's other trade initiatives to date. Our industry representatives in Washington have worked closely with the U.S. Trade Representative's Office (USTR) and communicated our support to Congress regarding Trade Promotion Authority, the Chile and Singapore FTAs, the Free Trade Area of the Americas, and the Central American Free Trade Agreement, in addition to the other FTAs that USTR is currently pursuing. We have also supported the U.S. Government's negotiating strategies in the current World Trade Organization round. In fact, several of our dairy sector representatives traveled to the Cancun Ministerial to be able to work closely with your negotiators as events developed.

As part of our ongoing engagement with USTR, we have communicated to them our concerns about the FTA with Australia. Because this is such a vital issue for us, however, we wanted to take the additional step of ensuring that you knew how damaging this agreement would be to us. We are not opposed to all trade - there are many initiatives that offer the promise of mutual gains and growth in exports. The agreement with Australia, however, is different. It poses absolutely no benefits for the U.S. dairy industry. In fact, an agreement with Australia will have a devastating economic effect on the very Rural America that elected you into office.


The U.S.-Australia FTA would force several thousand dairy farms, mostly small and medium family farms, out of business, causing the industry to undergo major consolidation. Following the massive drop in farm numbers, hundreds of manufacturers will also go out of business raising unemployment in rural America. NMPF estimates that over 1 million jobs nationwide could be impacted by increased Australian dairy imports. Because family farms are the vital core of rural America, the impact of these lost jobs would weigh most heavily on communities least able to withstand the added strain.

Rural America strongly supported you in the 2000 election. We believed that your Administration would defend our entrepreneurial and agricultural traditions. The deciding votes in the election were not cast by those in cities, but by those in rural communities who believed in your vision for America. Now we in rural America are asking for your help in ensuring that our communities remain vibrant. Family farming, of which dairy farmers are now such an important segment, lies at the heart of those communities. Please help support this important segment of American society by excluding dairy from the U.S.-Australia Free Trade Agreement.
