Summary of Conclusions

It was agreed that:

- A Presidential waiver of Glenn Amendment sanctions imposed on India and Pakistan after the 1998 nuclear tests will be recommended to the Principals Committee. (Action: NSC) (S)
- The State Department will consult with Congress and foreign governments to assure Congress that the Administration is consulted before the President makes a decision to waive sanctions. The consultations will begin September 12, 2001. State will also consult with interested foreign governments, especially those who have maintained with us, the G-7 multilateral sanction on IFI loans for India and Pakistan. (Action: State) (S)
- In preparation for Hill consultations on changes to the Entities List, the Deputies instructed the South Asia PCC to conduct a "Red Team" exercise to establish which entities should be added to or subtracted from the list agreed by Commerce, State, and Energy, based on whether they are a primary and principal contributor to Indian/Pakistani WMD programs. (Action: State) (S)
- India and Pakistan overall strategy paper will be drafted for the Principals Committee. The paper will be sent to the Principals Committee prior to its September meeting. (Action: NSC) (S)
- The overall direction and proposed strategy was approved for Afghanistan. (Action: All) (S)
- A working group led by the NSC and including State, DOD, and CIA, will operationalize the proposed strategy. (Action: NSC) (S)
- The group will also turn the strategy into a NSPD. Together with the counter-terrorism PCC, the working group will combine the proposed Afghanistan strategy and the al-Qaida strategy into a single NSPD. (Action: NSC) (S)
