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

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Council of State Neurosurgical Societies Professional Liability Insurance Survey Results

In late March, the Council of State Neurosurgical Societies conducted a survey of neurosurgeons across the country to gather preliminary professional liability insurance data. The survey was sent by broadcast fax to approximately 2,400 neurosurgeons in all 50 states. 563 were returned, for a 24% response rate. Responses were received from 49 states. The survey asked for premium and coverage limit information for 2000 through 2002. The survey also asked a number of questions to gauge behavioral responses, such as "Do you plan to retire, move or restrict your practice as a result of increases in professional liability insurance (PLI) costs?" A summary of the overall survey results follows:

Overall Survey Results

Premium Cost Information

The survey demonstrated that there clearly are multiple states where PLI costs have skyrocketed since 2000. The results also demonstrated that neurosurgeons in nearly <u>all</u> states have had increases in their PLI costs.



Liability Success Stories

The survey also showed that there are several states where PLI costs have remained stable or even decreased, over the past 3 years. In nearly most instances, these were states that have enacted meaningful tort reform laws, and include (in alphabetical order): California, Connecticut, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Nebraska, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oklahoma and Wisconsin. 

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

Media Knock Iraq Attack Plans

Study Finds Networks, New York Times Critical of Potential Strike

WASHINGTON, DC—Media coverage of the Bush administration's consideration of a military strike against Iraq has been 72 percent negative, according to a study released today by the Center for Media and Public Affairs (CMPA). The study—which examined nightly network newscasts and The New York Times front page from July 1st through August 25th—also found that a majority of Republican sources were critical of the administration's stance.

Seventy-two percent of all assessments of the administration's frag strategy were negative, including 71 percent printed in The New York Times and 73 percent that aired on the networks. CBS aired the most balanced views of the Bush plan (56 percent negative) while evaluations on ABC and NBC were 80 percent and 76 percent negative, respectively. CBS also devoted 36 percent less air-time (30 minutes) to the Iraq debate than either ABC or NBC (48 minutes apiece).

A majority of Republican sources criticized the administration's posture towards Iraq (53 percent). GOP sources seen on network coverage were balanced (49 percent negative), while three of every five Republicans (59 percent) quoted in *The New York Times* disagreed with the White House. When sources not identified with a political party were cited, 88 percent of their comments were critical of the administration.

These are the latest results from **CMPA**'s ongoing study of political coverage on network TV news and in other major media outlets. This report is based on evaluations of Bush administration policies made by sources and reporters in 66 news stories broadcast on the ABC, CBS and NBC evening news and 19 stories featured on the front page of The New York Times during the eight weeks between July 1 and August 25, 2002.
