Scope and Content

The materials in FOIA 2017-0151-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

FOIA 2017-0151-F requested Staff Member Office Files related to Thomas “Tom” P. Bossert between January 1, 2007, and January 1, 2008.

This FOIA primarily contains reports, memoranda, lists, talking points, briefings, correspondence, handwritten notes, forms, information sheets, itineraries, resumes, and printed emails. The materials relate to Mr. Bossert’s activities as Special Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and Senior Director for Preparedness Policy. There are drafts of reports relating to national security topics, including the Department of Homeland Security’s National Response Framework, the National Strategy for Homeland Security, Homeland Security Presidential Directive 8 (HSPD-8), and Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards. Also

included are notes, agendas, and briefings for various meetings and conferences concerning telecommunications, national security professional development, GPS capabilities, and critical infrastructure protection. Personnel files, mostly covering Mr. Bossert's security clearance and access to the White House, can be found here as well.

Please note that a portion of classified records related to this request has not yet been processed. Additional records will be provided as they become available.

System of Arrangement

The materials in FOIA 2017-0151-F are a systematic body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

Records responsive to this FOIA were found in these collection areas – Staff Member Office Files.

Staff Member Office Files are maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity.

Staff Member Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
