**Highway Bill.** OMB and OLA heard several reports tonight that “someone in the House” offered “someone in the Senate” a compromise of \$286.5b. The House authorizers did not sign off on the compromise. OLA is speculating that Chairman Thomas may be the source of the proposal. The compromise reportedly offered 90.6 percent on scope and 60-40 split on projects (in favor of the House). The rate of return was undefined.

**Energy Bill.** Sen. Nelson (FL) offered an amendment to strike the section of the bill providing for a comprehensive inventory of OCS resources. The amendment failed 44-52. The Hagel amendment on global climate change, which sets up a voluntary program with incentives for carbon reduction, passed 66-29. Tomorrow there will be a vote on McCain-Lieberman climate change amendment, which creates a mandatory carbon cap.

**CAFTA.** The Speaker and Senator Frist resolved that they do not want to receive a bill until Thursday of this week at the earliest. Tomorrow, Secretary Johanns will send a letter to interested Members describing how he will implement the sugar program under the current Farm Bill and how the compensation program in CAFTA would operate.

**Public Discourse Project.** We convened a meeting today with WHC, HSC, NSC, and Communicators to discuss handling of the PDP letters to the agencies. We recommend 1) adopting Dan’s suggestion that we develop a comprehensive White Paper outlining the progress we’ve made. The White Paper would be helpful to the PDP but wouldn’t specifically respond to them. The White Paper could be released around July 15<sup>th</sup>. 2) Agencies make their own decisions whether to meet with the PDP, but should meet only informally, consistent with their treatment of any other outside group.

**Intelligence Authorization Act.** The House passed the Intel Auth bill today 409-16 after the Rules committee removed section 305 of the bill regarding personnel transfers within the intelligence community.

**BSE.** We expect results on the re-test at early as Friday.



### Other Issues

- Amtrak (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – The House Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation approved a bill including \$550 million for Amtrak, a cut of Amtrak subsidies by \$657 million. This limitation would not affect the Northeast Corridor, routes running through Pennsylvania, most corridor routes in the Midwest, trains running from Portland, Oregon to Vancouver, or corridor routes in California.
- *Appropriations (Kaplan/OMB; Silverberg) – Foreign Ops was reported out of Full Committee in the House today. There was lengthy discussion of Egypt.*
- Asbestos (Ho/DPC; Hook)
- Avian Flu (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) – HSC and DPC will hold a PCC on June 29<sup>th</sup> to discuss our domestic and international response.
- CAFE (Sharp/DPC; Hook) -- DOT is scheduled to issue an NPRM on CAFE standards by August. Principals agreed on 6/20 to move from a fleet-wide average to a system in which fuel economy stringency is based on vehicle size, and propose some increase in the standard (note: OVP opposes any increase). DOT could seek comment on a range of increases - from zero to 1.3 mpg – and use the information that comes in during the regulatory process to inform the final standard.
- *China (Shirzad/NSC; Silverberg) – NEC convened Principals this morning to review the strategy for the upcoming July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the JCCT as well as to discuss textile issues. Acting Under Secretary Tim Hauser and Deputy USTR Josette Shiner will meet in China on Thursday and Friday and report back to Principals next week. Secretary Snow and Chairman Greenspan will testify on Thursday before the Senate Finance Committee on China currency.*
- CFIUS (Russell/NEC; Katz) – CFIUS agencies have reached an agreement with Arcapita (Bahraini bank) that will end the CFIUS review of their merger with Cyprus (the Atlanta based communications company). The agreement was signed on Friday, and CFIUS did not need to send a recommendation today to the President whether to block the investment. Agencies and the companies agreed on transaction terms that are to wall off and mitigate possibilities for terrorist funding and the use of acquired facilities and information to conduct acts of terrorism.
- *Clear Skies (CEQ; Hook) -- EPA has the modeling underway. CEQ plans to brief Senate EPW staff on the modeling details this week or next. The outputs are expected in eight to ten weeks.*
- Community College Initiative (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – Chairman Regula recently marked up the Labor HHS Approps bill in subcommittee and included a provision to rescind \$125 million in FY 2005 community college grant funds. The Chairman is unhappy with the way DOL has constructed the grant program this year. He believes that workforce investment boards and one-stop career centers should be eligible for these funds, but we have always viewed this program as community college specific.
- Community Health Centers Poor County Initiatives (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) – On June 23<sup>rd</sup> HRSA Administrator Betty Duke will announce the criteria for the President's poor counties community health center initiative. DPC and OMB will review tomorrow a draft of the speech tomorrow. The funding for this initiative was part of the President's FY06 budget request. Although the grants won't be awarded until FY06, the announcing of the criteria is important in order to allow for sufficient planning time for grant applications.
- Cooperative Conservation Event (Pinero/DPC; Hook) – The conference is developing well with almost all of the 1,200 invitee slots filled and all speaker slots filled, representing a



wide range of stakeholders. Four cabinet secretaries and the EPA Administrator are on the agenda, along with several governors and non-Federal partners. CEQ is working with the agencies on what type of Administration announcements would be appropriate at the conference.

- Crime/Guns/Lautenberg (Ho/DPC; Hook) – DOJ/OLP formed a study group with the FBI to review the GAO report. The OLP group has developed its recommendations, which are currently before the AG. DOJ is recommending administrative and legislative changes. DPC will review them in the near future.
- Democracy Fund (OMB; Silverberg) – NSC and OMB are continuing to work to secure funding in the final bill.
- Drug Reimportation (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) – DPC, OLA and HHS met with Senate HELP staff recently. Enzi's office has prepared a confidential draft of an importation proposal. We did not take a position on their draft but reinforced the concerns in the December 2004 HHS task force report. Internally, FDA has reviewed the draft and has substantial safety concerns.
- EEO-1 (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – DPC has received cost estimates from EEOC. DPC, OMB, and Barry met recently with EEOC officials to discuss policy options given the revised cost estimates.
- EEOC Definition of "Applicant" (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – DOL has informally submitted an NPRM. OMB is working with DOL officials to improve the rule prior to formal submission.
- Elderly Housing (Halaska/DPC; Katz)
- Endangered Species Act (CEQ; Silverberg) – On 6/3, DPC hosted a deputies meeting with Interior officials to discuss our strategy on ESA. The decision was made to put administrative reform on hold pending legislative reform attempts this session. If the Hill makes no progress, as is anticipated, then the Administration will consider administrative reform proposals. Deputies encouraged Secretary Norton and DOI to speak more publicly on the issues surrounding ESA to build support for reform. We will also work with outside groups to do the same.
- Faith Based Initiative (Towey/OFBCI; Hook) - JCT published a report in January proposing twelve measures designed to eliminate fraud and abuse related to charities. OFBCI has concerns that a number of the provisions are unnecessary and would burden charities unfairly. Grassley is pushing to include a number of these provisions in the CARE Act. NEC hosted a meeting with Treasury's Office of Tax Policy last week to examine the provisions. Grassley's staff told OLA that they plan to mark up in late June or early July.
- FAA Labor Negotiations (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – On 6/7 FAA briefed DPC and OVP on the upcoming labor negotiations with their air traffic controllers. Since 1998 when the last contract was signed, controllers' compensation has increased 64% and FAA has seen its management flexibility erode. Unions set staffing levels, control schedules, and restrict the introduction of new technologies. FAA is looking to bring its inherited costs under control and recapture its management flexibility, and will be finalizing its specific pay and work rule proposals in July for exchange with the controllers' union. DPC will continue to monitor the negotiations.
- FDIC (Warsh/NEC; Katz)
- *Federal Sentencing Guidelines (Ho/DPC; Hook) – The Attorney General delivered a speech today approved by DPC and Counsel's office endorsing the construction of a*



*minimum guideline system. Judges would be bound by the guidelines minimum, but the guidelines maximum would remain discretionary.*

- FMLA (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – On 6/3, deputies reviewed DOL's proposed package of regulatory reforms to the FMLA. Deputies support most of the reforms, but there wasn't agreement to let DOL proceed with draft regs. The regulations would draw intense criticism from employer and women's groups, and some question the commitment of the employer community to fighting legislative attempts to undo the regulations. DPC will convene a principals meeting in the coming weeks to develop a recommendation on FMLA reform.
- GSEs (Warsh/NEC; Katz) – Secretary Snow, Hubbard, NEC and OLA met with Republican Senators from the Banking Committee tonight.
- G-8 (Shirzad/NSC; Silverberg)
- Head Start (Halaska/DPC; Hook) – The bill was marked up by Enzi's committee on 5/25. DPC and OLA have serious concerns that the policy does not contain enough reform, and the authorization levels are far above what was in our budget. The committee does plan to continue working and will offer another manager's amendment on the floor, but OLA doesn't hold much hope that we will get what we want.
- Health IT (Levin/DPC; Katz) -- The staffing changes to the American Health Information Collaboration (AHIC) charter have been sent to HHS. HHS hopes to publish it in the Federal Register by the end of the week.
- Helping America's Youth Initiative (Medina/DPC; Hook)
- Immigration (Ho/DPC; Hook)
- Indian Trust/Cobell (Ho/DPC; Hook) – McCain plans to introduce his bill in the first week or two of July. Officials from Interior, Treasury, and DOJ will meet with McCain's staff (accompanied by WH OLA) to express our interest in a legislative solution but get more details on what is currently under consideration before committing to any statement of principles.
- International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (Hutto/NEC; Katz) - The Government of Japan has cut a deal with the European Union on the International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (ITER) site. (ITER is the major international R&D effort to advance fusion energy.) Japan will cede the site to the EU, putting ITER in Cadarache, France, rather than in Rokkasho, Japan. It appears Japan will receive an additional \$1 billion in sweeteners from the EU in exchange. The US, South Korea, and Japan have long supported the Rokkasho site, while Russia, China, and the EU supported the Cadarache site.
- Job Training Reform (Sharp/DPC; Katz) – The Senate is hoping to schedule floor time on WIA in June or July. The bill does not include our reforms and has bad religious hiring language.
- Judicial Security (Ho/DPC; Hook) – DPC hosted a meeting on 6/20 on judicial security. DOJ gave a briefing on the efforts of its own working group, whose report DOJ will circulate informally to EOP shortly. DOJ was asked to prepare forward-leaning options on how to improve the quality of marshals, and the level of security offered to federal judges in general.
- Medical Liability (Ho/DPC; Silverberg) - House Democrats Baird, Moran, and Ruppertsberger introduced medical liability legislation on 5/25. Their bill would cap non-economic damages at \$800,000 and allow that figure to fluctuate with inflation.
- Medicaid Commission (NEC; Katz) – [REDACTED] b(6)

*developing alternative suggestions to replace these members tonight. We will have a final list for the Chief to review before HHS begins contacting proposed members.*

- Medical Device User Fee and Modernization Act (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) - OMB and DPC have extensively reviewed FDA's justification for MDUFMA fee revenue scenarios. We are comfortable with HHS negotiating a fee revenue increase between 4.5% and 9%. Keeping these levels in mind, negotiations should not result in a termination of the program, even if temporarily. Moreover, RIFs are not an option within these funding levels as well.
- Medicare Drug Implementation (Jackson; Katz)
- MCC (Shirzad/NSC; Silverberg) – NSC is convening Deputies tomorrow on ways to accelerate implementation.
- *Native Hawaiian (Ho/DPC; Hook) -- Principals will meet on Monday to resolve whether we should publicly raise concerns to the legislation. The Republican Policy Committee is expected issue a policy paper this week urging opposition to the bill.*
- NCLB (Medina/DPC; Hook)
- “Open Loop” Technology (Hannegan/CEQ; Katz) - Senator Vitter has a draft amendment that he may offer as part of the energy bill. The amendment would put a one-year moratorium on the use of any “open loop” technology in the Gulf and during that time require a scientific study from NOAA and the Coast Guard on the impact of multiple LNG facilities using “open loop” technology in the Gulf.
- Personal Stockpiles (Rapuano; HSC; Silverberg) – HHS has prepared a proposal, which Secretary Leavitt will briefly discuss at the HSC Principals meeting.
- Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act (Ho/DPC; Hook) -- House Judiciary Committee has reported its bill. There is some discussion that the House may wait on a vote and let the Senate act, but there is also a possibility that the House will have a vote after recess.
- Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act (Halaska/DPC; Katz) - HUD has been conducting outreach on the Hill on their proposed plan for RESPA reform. After meeting with Chairman Manzullo, they agreed to have him host a briefing for interested Members and senior staff on Thursday. The Chairman still has concerns and HUD is trying to assure him that they plan to do full scale outreach before moving forward with a proposed rule.
- School Choice (Troy/DPC; Hook) -- The President said at policy time that he favors a non-entitlement Pell type grant to high school students. DPC and the Department will be working together to develop a program that meets the President's specifications.
- Secure Flight (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – TSA is expecting to issue an Interim Final Rule in mid-June compelling airlines to submit their passenger manifests.
- Stem Cells (Levin/DPC; Silverberg) -- OLA reports that a Senate vote on stem cell funding seems likely in July, and notes rumors that it may be taken up early in the month, immediately following the July 4 recess. Senator Enzi is preparing a stem cell bill that may serve as a substitute for the language passed by the House or an amendment to it. DPC has reviewed the current language and concludes the bill is very problematic as it would violate the President's principle that federal dollars should not encourage the destruction of human embryos.
- Steroids (Ho/DPC; Hook) – Director Walters testified on 6/15 before the House Government Reform Drug Policy Subcommittee, which is holding a hearing on a national drug control reauthorization bill. DPC has cleared talking points for his testimony. Chairman Davis plans to attach his steroids bill to the reauthorization bill during mark-up this Thursday.

- Tax Reform (NEC; Katz) – Their next public meeting will be on July 20<sup>th</sup>.
- Telecom (Russell/NEC; Katz) - NEC hosted a Principals meeting 6/20 to discuss telecom reform. Principals agreed to attempt to replace the USF surcharge, which is assessed against long-distance revenues, with a flat fee for every phone number. Principals also agreed to pursue changes to the high cost program, which subsidizes local rural telephone companies, by capping the program and changing the structure of the subsidy to foster more competition. Principals did not reach a conclusion regarding reform to the E-rate program, which subsidizes schools and libraries, but several Principals cautioned against pursuing reform of this popular program.
- *TRLA* (Warsh/NEC; Katz) – *The Treasury report is currently being reviewed by CEA and OMB. By COB Thursday we will send the executive summary and transmittal letter into WH staffing. The report will be released by Treasury.*
- Tricare Rx (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) – The Coalition for Government Procurement filed suit against the DOD/VA in U.S. District Court on March 24. On June 17<sup>th</sup>, DOJ filed a motion to dismiss the entire lawsuit for lack of jurisdiction. The court has 15 days to rule on this motion.
- Union Financial Transparency (Sharp/DPC; Hook) – OIRA has begun its review of the proposed rule and has asked DOL for stronger justification. OMB is working with DOL to improve the rule in anticipation that it will undergo OMB clearance.
- Veterans (Leggitt/DPC; Katz) – We received a revised copy of the survey answers from VA. VA's intent is to release the revised draft as part of a House VA Committee hearing they announced last Tuesday. The hearing will take place on June 23<sup>rd</sup> to discuss veterans' health care modeling. DPC, OLA, Communications and OMB have reviewed the revised draft and believe it is ok to release.
- *Voting Rights Act* (Ho/DPC; Silverberg) – *DPC is hosting a meeting this Friday.*
