#### Pierre-Richard Prosper

#### Biography

Pierre-Richard Prosper was nominated by President Bush on May 16, 2001 to be the U.S. Ambassador-at-Large for War Crimes Issues and was sworn-in on Friday, July 13, 2001. In this position, he advises the Secretary of State directly on U.S. efforts to address serious violations of international humanitarian law, including genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes, committed in areas of conflict throughout the world. Ambassador Prosper oversees U.S. support for the creation and operation of courts and other judicial mechanisms to bring perpetrators of international humanitarian law to justice. Since September 11, 2001, Ambassador Prosper has played a key diplomatic role with foreign governments whose nationals have been captured in the war on terror.

From 1999 to 2001, Ambassador Prosper served as the Special Counsel and Policy Adviser to the previous Ambassador-at-Large for War Crimes Issues. Ambassador Prosper, a career prosecutor, was detailed to this position from the U.S. Department of Justice after serving as a Special Assistant to the Assistant Attorney General for the Criminal Division at the beginning of 1999.

During 1996 to late 1998, Ambassador Prosper served as a war crimes prosecutor for the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda. Appointed lead trial attorney by the U.N. Chief Prosecutor, Ambassador Prosper successfully prosecuted the matter of the *Prosecutor against Jean-Paul Akayesu*, the first ever case of genocide under the 1948 Genocide Convention and the first case of the Rwanda tribunal. In this 14 month courtroom battle, he won additional life-sentence convictions for Crimes Against Humanity and broke new ground in international law by convincing the Tribunal to recognize rape committed in time of conflict as an act of genocide and a crime against humanity.

Between 1994 and 1996, Ambassador Prosper was an Assistant United States Attorney for the Central District of California in Los Angeles. He was assigned to the Narcotics Section, Drug Enforcement Task Force, where he investigated and prosecuted major international drug cartels.

Prior to becoming an Assistant U.S. Attorney, Ambassador Prosper was a Deputy District Attorney for Los Angeles County, California between the years 1989 and 1994. His last two years were spent in the Hardcore Gang Division of the Bureau of Special Operations where he prosecuted gang-related murders.

Born in Denver, Colorado in 1963, the son of two physicians who emigrated from Haiti, Ambassador Prosper was raised in New York State. He graduated from Boston College, where he was a member of the Varsity Lacrosse team, and Pepperdine University School of Law. He has been recognized for his achievements and commitment to justice for all humanity by his alma maters, a variety of law associations, cities, and a Haitian American historical society. Ambassador Prosper is a member of the California Bar. He is fluent in French and has a working knowledge of Italian and Spanish.



Corrections Corporation of America (CCA) said it will partner with Dallas-based **Bill Glass Champions** for Life to provide the programs. Mr. Glass, a former pro football star, has been involved in

prison outreach for three decades. His organization is known as one of the largest and most successful evangelical prison ministries in the country.

CCA officials say they based their decision in part on the track record of prison ministries: lower recidivism rates, improved inmate and staff



morale and safety, and better-quality rehabilitation. They say it all adds up to lower costs. Nashville-based CCAoversees 55:000 inmates under contracts with federal, state, and local jurisdictions in 21 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico.

Now a judge in Nassau County, N.Y., has ruled that a male homosexual can sue a hospital as the spouse of another man who died a year ago of medical complications following an auto accident. The pair had exchanged vows and rings in a civil ceremony in Vermont in. late 2000.

The ruling is the first in the nation to treat a same-sex couple joined in a Vermont civil union as a married couple. Judge John P. Dunne said New York law allows a common-law spouse from another state to sue for wrongful death and a same-sex partner joined by Vermont's civil-union law should have the same right. State law, he noted, doesn't define "spouses" as being of the opposite sex:

The judge rejected an argument by St. Vincent's Hospital that the civil union was a "narrow circumstance" that allows an exception to federal doctrine requiring states generally to recognize each other's laws. Courts in other states have refused to validate the Vermont law for same-sex couples in their jurisdictions, including in divorce cases. ⊕ —E.P.

### New milestones in Democrat hypocrisy

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Three judicial-confirmation milestones on April 28 prove that the process is completely broken.

First, Senate Democrats launched another filibuster. This one, against appeals-court nominee Priscilla Owen, is because of what Democrats say they know about her. It complements the first one, against appeals-court nominee Miguel Estrada, which is because of what Democrats say they don't know about him.

It wasn't supposed to happen this way. Back on Feb. 14, Sen. Richard Durbin, D-Ill., insisted that the Estrada filibuster had to do only with lack of information about the nominee's views, not the views themselves. He said his fellow Democrats "to a person" agreed with him that as long as senators "know for whom we are voting," a vote should happen. And on Tuesday, Sen. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., similarly said that a different appeals-court nominee approved that day avoided a filibuster because he had "answered questions."

Priscilla Owen had not one, but two, hearings before the Judiciary Committee. Senate Democrats, including Durbin and Schumer, argued the second hearing was unnecessary because they know everything there is to know. The Durbin-Schumer standard obviously requires a vote on the Owen nomination.

The jarring inconsistency of also filibustering Priscilla Owen reportedly did give some Democrats pause (though probably not to a person). But even that momentary lapse in compliant obedience was quickly squashed. The abortion extremist groups that control the Democrat caucus said they would "score" a vote on whether to filibuster the Owen nomination. That is, the vote would be used to determine how pro-abortion senators really are. The need to be on NARAL President Kate Michelman's "A" list was too important. To paraphrase Emerson, confirmation consistency is the hobgoblin of little minds, avoided by little politicians.

A second April 28 milestone came with the confirmation of Jeffrey Sutton to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. He was in President Bush's first batch of 11 appeals-court nominees and, with his confirmation, a bare majority of that group has finally been approved.

Here's how math works in Leftistland. It took 720 days for six of 11 Bush nominees to be approved. The previous three presidents saw 11 of their first 11 nominees confirmed in an average of 81 days. Those two scenarios are equal to Sen. Schumer, who proclaimed on Tuesday that Democrats were not "being obstructionist."

Or consider this from another leftist math whiz. Sen. Durbin said on Tuesday that, without Mr. Sutton, "the Sixth Circuit is

evenly balanced now." He said that, it's on page S5442 of the Congressional Record. Yet on that day, the court's 10 full-time judges included six Democrat and four Republican appointees. Even with Mr. Sutton's appointment, the court is not "evenly balanced," at least as most normal Americans would measure it. I think perhaps it's Sen. Durbin who may not be evenly balanced.

Or how about this one from Sen. Tom Harkin, D-Iowa. He denounced what he claimed was a Republican scheme to "rush a vote" on Mr. Sutton. He even said that Republicans' effort to "ram this [nomination] through" meant that "we cannot debate it." He said that – it's on page S5445 (the second day of the Sutton non-debate, by the way). Mr. Sutton had been scheduled for a Judiciary Committee hearing in May 2001. Probably knowing that the partisan tables would soon turn and they would become the majority, Democrats scuttled that hearing and then simply ignored Mr. Sutton thereafter. Hundreds and hundreds of days later, now it's a rush job?

The other significant numbers from the Sutton confirmation show that the Democrats' obstruction machine gains something even when it loses. Only one judicial nominee in the last quarter-century has been confirmed with fewer than the 52 votes Mr. Sutton received. And the negative votes once again topped 40, the magic number needed to support a filibuster.

The third milestone is that Senate Democrats have finally admitted why they are so enamored of litmus tests and nominees' personal views. Sen. Durbin described the "extraordinary power" of federal judges this way: "Most of us in the Senate will come and go, and they will still be sitting on the bench with gavel in hand, in their black robes, meting out justice according to their own values. So it is important that we ask questions and make inquires as to what those values might be."

That's what leftists really believe, that judges decide their cases "according to their own values." Not according to law, but their own values. Since judges decide cases according to their own views, nominees with insufficiently leftist views are unlikely to render sufficiently leftist decisions. Hence, to leftists, such folks are simply unqualified to sit on the bench.

All of that in just two days, loads of proof that the confirmation process is broken and needs to be fixed.

Dear Speaker Hastert,

In his State of the Union Address this January, President Bush articulated a strong moral case for intervening in the AIDS crisis in Africa and the Caribbean. In February, we joined others in praising the principles outlined by the President for the \$15 billion Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief—principles based on sound evidence of practices that have reduced HIV prevalence in areas most ravaged by it, Uganda and Jamaica.

Regrettably, the legislative proposal for implementing the \$15 billion fund has not adhered to the vision articulated by the President. The bill produced last week by the House International Relations Committee failed in several respects to prioritize effective practices and to ensure accountability for this significant new funding. We urge you not to move this legislation to the floor. We are encouraged by word that another bill could be offered by the House Energy and Commerce Committee that would better address the concerns we have raised.

It is a moral imperative for America to use her strength for good in the face of this humanitarian crisis. That means ensuring that this money is spent on what we know works—and any money misdirected from those ends is a failure to save a life.

We have included a list of priorities that we share with other organizations and that must be embodied in any global AIDS legislation in order for it to be effective. We urge you not to support legislation that fails to abide by these principles. Thank you for your leadership on this critical issue. We look forward to working with you.

#### Principles for a Global AIDS Relief Bill

- Clear Prioritization of Prevention Strategies: Prevention programs that address behavior must emphasize risk elimination. The programs that have been most successful—in Uganda and Jamaica—have had clear messages about changing sexual behavior through abstinence and faithfulness. By contrast, African nations that have promoted only condom use and have the highest condom user rates on the continent—South Africa, Zimbabwe, Botswana and Kenya—also tend to have the highest IIIV prevalence rates. Historically, U.S.-funded programs have largely ignored the "A" and "B" and emphasized and supported only the "C" in the so-called "ABc" approach. U.S. global HIV/AIDS prevention must re-prioritize in statutory language and espouse in practice the successful Uganda and Jamaica approaches by making risk avoidance—abstinence, delaying sexual activity, marriage and monogamy—the primary defense against IIIV.
- Accountability through Bilateral Aid: The President has allotted \$1 billion over five years to the Global AIDS Fund, reserving the majority of the proposed funds for direction by the U.S. government. This bilateral aid is the most effective and efficient means for sending relief to those who daily face the risk of death. With the lives of millions currently in peril, time and resources are precious. Every cent that is spent on bureaucracy or agendas not in keeping with the President's proposal is that much less that will reach those affected by AIDS.
- Participation of and Protection for Faith-Based Organizations: Faith-based groups must be a key element of all HIV prevention and AIDS treatment programs. The Catholic Church alone currently cares for one in four people being treated for AIDS worldwide. Religious missionaries already possess much of the infrastructure, experience, knowledge, and compassion that will be needed to carry out these programs and must be an integral part of U.S. efforts. Because they are such an important part of this effort, religious organizations must be protected from being coerced to promote activities that violate or contradict their faith as a condition of receiving U.S. financial assistance.
- Initiatives to Combat Sexual Violence: Any effective initiative to combat the spread of HIV/AIDS must address the problem of sexual victimization. Traditional prevention strategies seek to encourage and empower healthy choices about sexual behavior, but victims of coercive sexual encounters do not get to make choices about their sexual activities. This global HIV/AIDS bill must call attention to the problem of sex trafficking and prostitution, and prohibit funds to any groups that support, legitimize, or facilitate prostitution.
- Appointment of the Global AIDS Coordinator: In order for the U.S. government to proceed with a coherent and competent global HIV/AIDS relief policy, the individual who holds the position of global AIDS coordinator created by this legislation must be committed to upholding the principles that the President has outlined, and must have the latitude to carry them out. This legislation must allow the President to appoint a coordinator who shares his vision and who can implement it effectively.



## THE MARGARET H. CONE CENTER AND THE LANGUAGE ENRICHMENT AND ACTIVITIES PROGRAM

In 1989, the Texas Instruments Foundation decided to improve the educational performance of children in the local community. TI Foundation determined the best way to make a long-term impact would be to fund the development and replication of a model preschool program for children from low-income families. The foundation recognized the fundamental soundness of the Head Start program and believed it could demonstrate that a Head Start center, with appropriate programmatic enhancements, could prepare low-income children from any environment for academic success in school. The foundation invited Head Start of Greater Dallas to be its partner and together they developed the Margaret H. Cone Head Start Center, now in its thirteenth year of operation.

The Cone center, located within one of the most impoverished and neglected communities in Dallas, serves 90 children. Most families enrolled in the Cone center are headed by a single parent and survive on less than \$7,500 annually. Unemployment among these families approaches 76 percent while only 41 percent of parents have a high school diploma. The families are primarily African American, although there is a small but increasing number of Hispanic families.

TI Foundation underwrote increased salary and benefits for the staff, intensive teacher training, a full-time nurse practitioner, two full-time social workers and a parent employment program. Determined to measure the effectiveness of the center, the foundation funded the University of Texas at Arlington to conduct ongoing research and evaluation. The children were tracked through standardized test scores and other data. When test results showed broad gains in all developmental domains except for cognitive and language skills, the foundation commissioned Nell Carvell at the Southern Methodist University Learning Therapy Program to design a curriculum addressing the deficits. The Language Enrichment Activities Program (LEAP) is the result of those efforts.

Research demonstrates that growth in language development is a vital component of effective preschool education and is essential to later success in school. LEAP develops children's language skills through activities that encourage interactive listening; print and phonological awareness; knowledge of letters, numbers and basic concepts; a basic understanding of mathematical and scientific reasoning, the development of writing skills and an appreciation of books.

LEAP has become the centerpiece of the Cone center's success. Once Head Start children from the Cone center enter public school, they equal or outperform children from any other background. Median scores on the nationally respected Iowa Test of Basic Skills increased from the 20 and 30<sup>th</sup> percentiles in 1992 and 1993 to the 60 and 70<sup>th</sup> percentiles in 1995. This success has led Head Start to implement LEAP and the Cone center's innovative blend of program elements in its remaining 26 centers. LEAP has also been implemented in the Dallas Independent School District's pre-k program.

Encouraged by this success, the foundation began promoting the model program on the state level. In 1998, they were able to attract the support of then Governor George W. Bush and First Lady Laura Bush, who successfully urged the Texas Legislature to appropriate \$17 million to replicate LEAP and foster similar programs throughout the State of Texas. Now in the White House, the President and First Lady are pointing to the Margaret H. Cone Center and LEAP as a model for preparing children for success in school.

## Dallas Early Childhood Reading Initiative National Demonstration Project

In 2002 a diverse group of businesses, civic organizations, government representatives, foundations and education providers created the Dallas Early Childhood Reading Initiative Working Group (DECRI).

**Situation:** A majority of economically disadvantaged children are unprepared for school and often enter kindergarten with language abilities well behind children from middle-income families. The gap between a child's achievement and potential widens over time limiting academic success.

Vision: For every child to arrive at kindergarten ready to read, ready to learn.

#### Mission:

- Provide a language-rich, scientifically-based and research-based preliteracy curriculum to every economically disadvantaged child whose family income is less than 185% of the poverty level.
- Serve as national & state demonstration project for collaboration between federal, state and locally funded childcare providers, universities, nonprofits, businesses and foundations to affect change in the community.
- Use the Dallas Independent School District (DISD) and Head Start of Greater Dallas as model.
- Initial deployment within boundaries of DISD, followed by Dallas County.
- Engage all eligible preschool providers including Head Start Centers, regional school districts, state-funded, private and faith-based programs.

Partners: Head Start of Greater Dallas; DISD; the Child Care Group (CCG)/Child Care Management Services (CCMS); the Foundation for Community Empowerment; the Dallas Housing Authority; the Greater Dallas Chamber; the Dallas Citizens Council; WorkSource for Dallas County; READ for Texas; Southern Methodist University; Luce & Williams, Ltd.; the Texas Instruments Foundation.

Pre-Literacy Curriculum: Language Enrichment Activities Program (LEAP) created by Nell Carvell at Southern Methodist University with assistance from the Texas Instruments Foundation.

**About LEAP:** Created in the early 1990s, LEAP focuses on enhancing vocabulary development, phonological awareness, listening skills, fine motor skill development and math and science concepts. A central component of LEAP is its teacher training program with a focus on instructor's language skills and the application of LEAP materials. LEAP also provides role modeling in the classroom by trained volunteers.

LEAP was first deployed at the Margaret Cone Head Start Center in one of the lowest-income regions in Dallas. Performance data has been central to assess the success of the program. Children who took the lowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) at their local elementary school (Julia C. Frazier) after a year at Cone in 1990-1992 – prior to the implementation of LEAP – scored on average in the 20<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup> percentile. A big increase occurred after the children were exposed to LEAP and teaching was upgraded in the elementary school. Average scores on the ITBS in the mid-late 1990s increased to the 60<sup>th</sup> -70<sup>th</sup> percentile, hitting the 94<sup>h</sup> percentile in vocabulary (ITBS). By the end of the 2001-2002 school year, 90% of "LEAP" children at Frazier were reading at grade level. A bilingual curriculum has also been developed and deployed to serve Spanish-speaking children at the Jerry Junkins Child Development Center in West Dallas.

Head Start of Greater Dallas has implemented LEAP in all of it's 27 sites. In addition, LEAP will be used in 240 preschool classrooms in DISD during 2002-2003, led by approximately 500 teachers trained in LEAP. Educators around Texas and in other states including Alabama, California, Louisiana, Maine and Virginia are also integrating LEAP into preschool programs.

**Dallas Early Childhood Reading Initiative Status Report:** In addition to agreeing on a common curriculum, DISD, Head Start, and CCG have agreed to a comprehensive plan to incorporate LEAP into their pre-school programs beginning with the 2003-04 school year. Training and acquisition of materials is well underway. The providers are finalizing execution and evaluation standards and secured some funds to begin the execution.

What can you do to help? This program has been developed with the goal of state and national replication. DECRI will define best practices, required resources and essential participants needed in such a collaboration to facilitate deployment in other communities around the state and country.

To support implementation and replication, DECRI seeks to include the federal and Texas state governments in this collaboration. Corporate and Foundation contributions will be pursued to complement federal and state funding support.





# The Worst Time For The 'Road Map' — Right Now

On the eve of the war with Iraq, President Bush announced that he would soon be announcing the much discussed "Road Map" for peace in the Middle East. The timing was intended to help our staunch ally, British Prime Minister Tony Blair, weather a political storm at home.

But the time is wrong for several reasons:

The "Quartet" has little credibility.

While all eyes have been on President Bush, the plan is to be issued and supported by the so-called Quartet — The U.S., the UN, the European Union and Russia. Do any of our partners have sufficient credibility to be offering their input on how to deal with the difficult issues of terrorism and defense?

The United Nations has failed consistently to enforce even its own tepid resolutions of disarmament in Iraq. They failed to act in Kosovo and have even failed to act on violations of recent security council actions against terrorism by allowing Syria to continue to harbor terrorists without a peep of protest. And lest we forget, this is a body that has equated Zionism with racism while doing nothing as a wave of anti-Semitism sweeps Europe.

The EU and Russia have not been much better. They have abdicated their role as international leaders by actively supporting Saddam Hussein with words and deeds.

How can the Russians sponsor a plan to bring security to Israel when they have exported technology to jam United States missiles and weapon technology to our enemies?

As for the European Union, has France shown a commitment to stopping terror?

The Germans?

Even our friends the British have demonstrated an insensitivity to the realities of the region. As bombs were dropping in Bagdad, British Foreign Minister Jack Straw equated Iraq with Israel with respect to violations of UN resolutions. Putting aside how wrong this is in fact, it is an odious glimpse into the mind of a "sympathetic" member of the Quartet.

The Palestinians Are Not Ready — Still.

If there has been one lesson that the world has learned about the Palestinians under the leadership of Yasir Arafat it is that they need to be judged on their actions, because their words have been hollow. An important recent action must be judged before any road map is considered — the appointment of a Prime Minister.

While the past of Abu Mazen is checkered by his denial of the Holocaust, he has made important statements about the futility and harm of the Palestinian strategy of empowerment via terror. But platitudes are meaningless if two tests are not passed.

First, Mazen must be given the authority to shut down the terror network that has been funded, harbored and con-

trolled by Yasir Arafat.

The second test is how he uses his new authority. Until the new Palestinian Prime Minister is empowered and passes the vital test of his actions, the most important party is not ready for peace — the Palestinians.

The Road Map Has Too Many Road Blocks.

If Israel is to accept the Road Map, there are still reportedly major changes that need to be made before it is released. Among the demands by the Israeli government, according to sources in Jerusalem as reported in *Häaretz*. include:

• A change of the Palestinian leadership. (Something

that President Bush has echoed).

•Bilateral negotiations and an agreement with Israel before establishment of a Palestinian state, first in temporary borders and later with a permanent status agreement.

• Rejection of the Saudi initiative, calling for Israel to withdraw to the 1967 borders, as one of the cornerstones of

the agreement.

• Detailing of security demands of the Palestinians, including arrest, interrogation and trial of terror suspects, and clarification that a Palestinian state can only be founded after complete dissolution of the terrorist infrastructure.

• Freedom of operation for the Israel Defense Forces against terrorism in Palestinian Authority territory.

• Israel will agree to freeze settlement activity only after quiet has been achieved and will not agree to dismantle settlements during the interim period.

Palestinian recognition of Israel as a Jewish state.

President Bush deserves credit for sticking to the notion that Palestinian violence must end and Palestinian leadership must change before exerting pressure for a peace plan. We pray that those conditions are met, but it is clear that they have not yet been.
