Dear Secretary Nicholson:

We are writing to you in support of the use of the Pennhurst property as the future site of the Southeastem Pennsylvania veterans cemetery and urge your strong consideration of the site as you finalize your site determination pursuant to the applicable legislation.

Specifically, the Pennhurst property is much more desirable to the residents and veterans of Chester, Montgomery, Berks and Delaware Counties, first and foremost, because of its centrality and accessibility to the region. Pennhurst, located on the northern edge of Chester County, is just minutes from Berks and Montgomery County, is a short drive from Delaware County, and it provides the most convenient burial option in our region for our veterans and their families. It is located a couple of miles off of Route 422, which directly connects to most of the major interstates in Southeastern Pennsylvania, and avoids some of the most congested and heavily traveled roads in our region that surround the City of Philadelphia.

In contrast, the Dolington property in Upper Makefield presents enomous challenges to residents in our counties as they make the trip across the region to the farthest eastern part of Southeastern Pennsylvania, often navigating extremely congested and heavily traveled roadways. While we understand the cemetery will also service parts of New Jersey, that state's residents unlike the five counties surrounding Philadelphia, already have an accessible and convenient state veterans cemetery to serve their residents. Choosing Dolington would neglect the portion of the region that currently has the most need for a new veterans cemetery and many would unfortunately continue to make the trek to Fort Indiantown Gap which would remain more convenient than the edge of Bucks County.

The support for a cemetery at Pennhurst is overwhelming. Numerous officials and organizations throughout our counties have declared their support for the Chester County location, as has the Pennsylvania State Veterans Commission. Many statewide officials have also endorsed Pennhurst as the preferred location, including Governor Rendell, the State Adjutant General and numerous state senators and representatives. The only support for the Dolington property comes from within Bucks County.

We understand the responsibility of the Department of Vetarans Affairs to make a sound decision. That decision must take into account several factors, including availability, cost and input by the veterans and officials in the region. That being said, it is our understanding that the Pennsylvania Department of General Services has made the Pennhurst property available immediately at a lower price than what was asked for Dolington. Therefore we believe that all of the factors weigh clearly in favor of Pennhurst as the future site of the veterans cemetery in Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Dear Mr. President:

The report issued a few days ago by your White House Task Force on Puerto Rico's Status is making history, but not in a sudden or noisy way. As expected, there has been some bluster and hand-wringing by those who believe the truth has been spoken at the expense of their ideology. But over time, the principle of government by consent of the governed will be redeemed in Puerto Rico in a very determined and deliberate way.

That is because the report tells the truth in a fair and simple way concerning the terms for continuing the current territorial status with the commonwealth model of local selfgovernment. If that should be what Congress decides based on the freely expressed will of the residents of the territory, after the options for non-territorial status have been duly considered, then at least it will not be because the right of self-determination has been denied.

The policy set forth in the Task Force report also confirms the legitimacy of statehood as a model for territorial status resolution. Similarly, the report affirms that there is a model for an orderly process of territorial succession to separate nationhood, if that be the will of the nation and the residents of the territory. That includes the possibility of a treaty based free association, terminable by either party, consistent with the right of all sovereign peoples to independence.

The Administration could have repeated the same old platitudes about supporting whatever the voters decide, but under your leadership the Task Force recognized that no

real choice is possible without informed self-determination. So you chose to do the hard unfinished work of democracy in America.

At a time when Americans from Puerto Rico are fighting terrorism so people in foreign countries can vote for their national leaders, it was morally necessary for the Task Fore to tell the truth about how that right also can be extended to this territory.

The truth is not pro-statehood, pro-independence, or pro-commonwealth. It is the truth, and God has given us the freedom to tell it and decide how best to use it. Your Administration has spoken the truth plainly and yet profoundly. Now it is up to Congress and the 3.8 million U.S. citizens of Puerto Rico to put it to good use in service to the national interest.

Thanks you for your courageous leadership of our nation.

I am writing this letter to you to plea on behalf of the residents and citizens of the New Orleans metropolitan area to reconsider your position of not providing federal funding to Entergy New Orleans, Inc. There is growing sentiment among our citizens that the current Administration has forgotten the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina. As a tax paying, voting American I am writing to express my concerns over the position, either implicit or explicit, that the Administration has taken with respect to this issue.

The correspondence with Allan Hubbard, Chairman, Gulf Coast Recovery and Rebuilding Council has been reported in the local news. The reports on this correspondence indicate that the federal government is providing disaster relief in other areas but will not include federal funding to Entergy New Orleans, the local utility company, because Entergy New Orleans is owned by Entergy Corporation, a large investor owned utility and has separate bond holders and shareholders that should bear the risk and results of Katrina. Without going into details about how each Entergy company effectively stands on its own for financing and rate purposes, it suffices to say that this is a very upsetting position for most of the residents of the city and state to hear. First, it seems totally inconsistent that the Administration would take this position for damage resulting from Katrina while Consolidated Edison and Verizon, both investor owned companies, were appropriated significant funds for assistance after September 11, to, among other things, restore the utility infrastructure damaged by, and for economic revitalization directly related to the 9/11 attack. This position is one that makes me shake my head in disbelief and one that makes me want to ensure that those elected or appointed officials that are in support of this total inconsistency in position will be vehemently opposed in future elections via my personal vote in each and every election in which I have the appropriate standing to vote. Electricity is of the most basic of needs and we need Entergy New Orleans to be able to meet that need for the metropolitan New Orleans area to recover.

The Administration is constantly having to support the amount of funds directed toward the war on terror and probably wonders why people question their strategy. The position taken on Katrina and then differing position after 9/11 is one prime example of what upsets Americans so much. It emphasizes the concern across the country that the Administration cares less about what is happening at home versus overseas. We can all appreciate that the war on terror has the intent of protecting us all from terrorists. But this initiative and effort has to be balanced with real, current and significant needs of its citizens such as the devastation caused by Katrina. Most of the metropolitan New Orleans population has been displaced by the storm but if, and when they return, they will face extremely high utility bills as a result of the need for Entergy New Orleans to recover its prudently incurred costs. This issue will be a determining factor in how many people do indeed return to the city and whether Entergy New Orleans will be able to recover financially from Katrina. Entergy New Orleans' has experienced real and significant financial issues as evidenced by the recent filing of a Chapter 11 petition for bankruptcy. The citizens of the city and state are not supportive of municipalizing the utility because we believe that Entergy has done and would continue to do an amazing job of restoring power as a result of the storms – restoring approximately 1 million customers to service for those who could receive service in an incredible timeframe of less than 50 days. However it is very surprising to me that if the utility were a municipality it would be eligible for federal funds – although the financing and rate structure would be virtually identical if the utility were owned by the city of New Orleans versus Entergy. My personal opinion is that if the utility were run by the city, although the financial structure of the utility would likely be the same, that service and reliability would suffer greatly and the weary and bruised citizens of New Orleans and the surrounding areas do not need that right now.

New Orleans is a great city. Despite the scars of Katrina and the negative press of its citizens and its politics, it is a beautiful city. It has deep roots and history. The Louisiana Purchase opened exploration to what is now most of the United States. It would be a tragedy for the President to broadcast, from Jackson Square, one of the city's landmarks and the site of the celebration of the Louisiana Purchase, that the Administration would do whatever it takes to restore and rebuild the city, and for that promise to go unfulfilled. We are telling you what we need and asking and pleading for help. Entergy New Orleans met its obligations during Katrina – and Rita. We are proud of them and we need them and we are asking you to help them. And we, as voting Americans, will take note and hold you accountable in future elections for your actions.

Karl:

Hope you are well. As you may have heard, Wirthlin Worldwide and Harris Interactive merged in January, thus the reason for the name change.

Dr. Wirthlin asked that I contact you regarding some information we are working on. If you could point me to the right person for this, that would be helpful.

We are working to create a common, global platform whereby all tracking-based market research would be structured and fed into. Think of this at a systems level and where all data moves seamlessly in a common platform. Questionnaires can be common across stakeholder types of "core metric" questions, but then flex with new sections for certain key audiences. Poor ratings (based on whatever one would set) would trigger an alert to the user and initiate a follow-up action. Charting and data tables could be posted via desktop for easy use or housed in a central web-based environment. There is a lot more complexity, but at a simple, strategic level you probably see what we are trying to create.

Dick created something like this for The White House in the 80s, but at a crude level.

I know this sounds somewhat abstract (more so in writing), but we were hoping that if anyone had tried to do this in today's technology it would be you. We were thinking you could help with any new ideas or ways in which the campaign or WH does something similar. Perhaps if you could share any "best practices" in this area or at a very high level the design architecture of how this may have been developed/used.

I left word with Ken Mehlman as well to see if he was aware of anything.

Dear Mr. Hubbard,

I appreciate the time taken by you and others on the White House staff to discuss issues affecting the restoration and rebuilding of New Orleans.

Based on your comments during yesterday's meeting, I have informed Dan Packer, President and CEO of Entergy New Orleans, that the Bush Administration is opposed to any form of Federal assistance, whether direct or indirect, to electric and gas consumers within the City of New Orleans. I am gravely disappointed in the Administration's decision to apply narrow, free market considerations so strictly as to refuse to provide the City of New Orleans or Entergy New Orleans with Federal disaster assistance, as the consumers in the City will suffer significantly as a result, and I believe that everyone there has suffered enough.

I believe that the approach taken yesterday by the Administration is fundamentally flawed and one-sided. Particularly troubling is that the Administration's approach repudiates the promise made by the President during his nationally telecast remarks from Jackson Square in New Orleans on September 15, that the Administration would "do what it takes" and "stay as long as it takes to help citizens rebuild their communities and their lives."

I also want to state clearly that I disagree with your regrettable sentiment that Entergy's shareholders and bondholders are not relevant. Shareholders and bondholders have invested in a regulated utility with the knowledge that the government regulates and protects their opportunity to earn a return. Unlike electric generation, the local distribution system represents a regulatory compact between the investor-owned utility and the government that requires the utility to provide universal and reliable electric and gas service regardless of circumstance. Crushing shareholders and bondholders would not only make a difficult situation worse and dishonor the regulatory compact, it will increase the capital costs (for both equity and debt) of every other utility, as investors will require additional and significant compensation for the associated risk.

The situation in New Orleans is unique – no major American city has ever been evacuated on a long term basis before, and no utility company has ever faced the double-barreled catastrophe of huge infrastructure restoration costs and a revenue stream cut by two-thirds due to such an evacuation.

On December 1, 2005, the Entergy Board of Directors will meet to consider whether to continue to finance Entergy New Orleans. As part of that Board's deliberations, I will be compelled to state clearly to the Entergy Board the Bush Administration's position toward the Company, its investors and its customers as outlined by you:

- The Administration will not provide any financial assistance to the electric and gas consumers within the City of New Orleans, because doing so might indirectly benefit Entergy shareholders or bondholders.
- The Administration will not provide assistance to the electric and gas consumers of New Orleans for restoration costs but rather those costs will have to be borne by the consumers themselves.
- The Administration's position on financial assistance will remain unchanged regardless of the outcome of Entergy New Orleans' bankruptcy proceedings.

I honestly cannot believe that President Bush would agree with your position. It certainly is not reflective of his proclamation declaring a National Day of Prayer and Remembrance for the Victims of Hurricane Katrina. "As the American people unite to help those who are hurting," the President wrote on that occasion, "we share a determination to stand by those affected by Hurricane Katrina in the months and years ahead as they rebuild their lives and reclaim their future. We are determined that the Gulf Coast region will rise again." I am encouraged that Mr. Powell has committed to discuss the issue with the President directly.

Finally, your viewpoint is inconsistent and appears to make a distinction between the needs of the prosperous occupants of lower Manhattan after the tragedy of 9/11 - when the Administration provided assistance directly to the local utility and its shareholders and bondholders -- and the needs of the displaced and disproportionately poor residents of New Orleans after the single most significant natural disaster in American history. Just as the people of New York turned to the Bush Administration for help in a crisis four years ago, so do the electric and gas consumers in New Orleans do so today.

Please advise me prior to the December 1 Board meeting if any of the information in this letter is inaccurate or does not reflect the Administration's position.

Lawmakers begin considering reconstruction ideas

WASHINGTON (AP) Now that the \$62 billion down payment is on its way, Gulf Coast lawmakers and their staffs are turning their attention to what comes next.

Is a financial bailout of New Orleans next on the federal agenda because Hurricane Katrina will dry up most sources of local tax revenue? What about rebuilding the Gulf Coast? Is a new reconstruction agency needed?

Could the depression-era Works Progress Administration be replicated in Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama to put storm victims back to work rebuilding their communities?

The emergency money does nothing to address the massive rebuilding faced by residents. But quick approval of the money does buy Congress some time to make a more thorough assessment of the damage and to develop a more comprehensive relief package.

"This effort is going to evolve and the most important thing is just to move it forward," said Sen. Mary Landrieu, D-La. "We don't know the answers today. We don't even know all the questions to be asked."

Lawmakers probably will pass a third emergency aid bill soon, but only after regular hearings in which federal agencies will have to justify their spending needs. For the first \$62 billion, Congress just fell in line with the Bush administration's request.

Congressional delegations in the three states are working on legislation to eliminate red tape that might slow or block aid from getting out.

The House last week, for example, approved a bill by Rep. Bobby Jindal, R-La., to waive a requirement that would have forced students whose studies were interrupted by the hurricane to begin repaying their federal college loans.

Congress also enacted legislation allowing the federal courts to operate outside their normal jurisdictions.

But most of the discussions have centered on three far-reaching issues: the reconstruction of the hundreds of destroyed homes and businesses; the financial crisis in New Orleans; and restoring the Louisiana coast to lessen the impact of future hurricanes.

"The federal government needs to think innovatively," Sen. Trent Lott, R-Miss, said last week. "What do we want to do to avoid this sort of problem in the future and how can we do whatever we do better

than we have done it?"

Congressional aides say research is under way on the idea of a new reconstruction agency, along the lines of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency normally would oversee reconstruction efforts after a hurricane. But the agency's slow initial response to Katrina and the unprecedented devastation make it more likely that lawmakers will look elsewhere.

``Former approaches may not work in this set of circumstances," said Rep. Jim McCrery, R-La. ``We may have to think outside the box. We may want to create some overarching entity to direct the efforts."

McCrery said there almost certainly will be some type of jobs program for hurricane victims that is patterned after the New Deal's WPA.

`I think that's going to happen," he said. ``The plan is to create temporary jobs for the cleanup and getting locations ready for reconstruction and rebuilding. And then, even in the rebuilding process, there may be jobs created with a preference given to displaced persons from those areas."

New Orleans was set to send out property tax assessments this month. With the city vacated for who knows how long, both property tax and sales tax revenues will dry up, forcing the city and school board to stop paying their employees or face bankruptcy, unless there is a federal bailout.

There were only 11 no votes in the 435-member House and none in the Senate last week when the second emergency spending bill was approved. But Gulf Coast lawmakers are worried that support in Congress may erode as the unprecedented scale of the reconstruction and financial problems facing the area becomes clearer.

"There is a tremendous concern about what comes after this," said Rep. Jo Bonner, R-Ala.

``Last week was really just a Band-Aid to get us through October. There are many people that are genuinely worried about how far we can go in an attempt to get the Gulf Coast back on its feet without setting a dangerous and unaffordable precedent for future disasters," she said.

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
