

The commentaries are also carried in translation on all state-owned radio stations in the People's Republic of China. He is seen on 80 television stations daily in the United States.

For 14 years, Dr. Dobson was an Associate Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Southern California School of Medicine, and he served for 17 years on the Attending Staff of Children's Hospital of Los Angeles in the Division of Child Development and Medical Genetics. He received a Ph.D. from the University of Southern California (1967) in the field of child development. He is a clinical member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, a licensed psychologist in California, and listed in Who's Who in Medicine and Healthcare.

I. PURPOSE

To deliver the commencement address at the United States Air Force Academy.

II. BACKGROUND

The United States Air Force Academy is situated on 18,000 acres located against the eastern slope of the Colorado Rocky Mountains. It provides its students a four-year education with a full scholarship. The Academy annually commissions approximately 1,000 second lieutenants. Following graduation, each second lieutenant is obligated to serve at least five years in the armed forces. If they attend pilot training while at the Academy, they are required to perform ten years of service.

History of the Academy

The United States Air Force Academy is the newest of the service academies, having been established on April 1, 1954. The first class entered in July 1955 at temporary facilities at Lowry Air Force Base in Denver. The Cadet Wing moved to its permanent home in August 1958. The first class of 207 cadets graduated in 1959. Women cadets first entered the Academy in 1976, with the first class graduating in 1980.

The Cadet Experience

More than 9,000 applicants seek appointments to the Academy each year. Only approximately 1,200 are selected to begin Basic Cadet Training, a rigorous, five-week summer orientation program that introduces cadets to military life.

Air Force Academy cadet development focuses on character development, professional military training, academics, and athletics.

The school colors are blue and silver, and the school mascot is the falcon. There are approximately 4,000 cadets and 60 international students attending the Academy. The Air Force Academy provides 50 percent of Air Force pilots.

The Class of 2004

The Class of 2004 has 968 cadets graduating. There are 98 distinguished graduates, the top ten percent of the class. Eighty-five percent of the class is male and 15 percent of the class is female.

There are eight international cadets graduating (with two of these being distinguished graduates) from the following countries: Jordan, Morocco, Taiwan, Singapore, Romania, South Korea, Thailand, and Lithuania.

In the class of 2004, seven cadets will be cross-commissioned into other services (two in Army, four in Marine Corps, and one Navy). There are 69 Post Graduate Scholarship/Fellowship Winners.
