



PURPOSE

I.

To deliver the commencement address at the United States Air Force Academy.

II. BACKGROUND

The Air Force Academy

Congress authorized creation of the Air Force Academy on April 1, 1954. The first class entered in July 1955 at temporary facilities at Lowry Air Force Base in Denver. The Cadet Wing moved to its permanent home in August 1958. The first class of 207 cadets graduated in 1959. Women cadets first entered the Academy in 1976, with the first women graduating in 1980.

The Academy is located against the eastern slope of the Colorado Rocky Mountains and is situated on 18,000 acres 7,000 feet above sea level. More than 9,000 applicants seek appointments to the Academy each year. Only approximately 1,200 are selected to begin Basic Cadet Training, a rigorous, five-week summer orientation program that introduces cadets to military life. The Academy's mission statement is to educate, train, and inspire men and women to become officers of character, motivated to lead the United States Air Force in service to our Nation.

The Cadet Experience

The Academy annually commissions approximately 1,000 second lieutenants. Following graduation, each second lieutenant is obligated to serve at least five years in the armed forces. If a cadet attends pilot training while at the Academy, he or she is required to perform 10 years of service.

Air Force Academy cadet development focuses on character development, professional military training, academics, and athletics.

The school colors are blue and silver, and the school mascot is the falcon. There are approximately 4,000 cadets and 60 international students attending the Academy. The Air Force Academy provides 50 percent of Air Force pilots.

The Class of 2008

The Class of 2008 is the 50th class to graduate from the Academy. The class motto is "Elige Sortem Tuam" or "Choose Your Fate." This year's class has 1,012 cadets graduating. There are approximately 100 distinguished graduates, meaning the top 10 percent of the class. 18 percent of the class is female.

The class exemplar is First Lieutenant Karl Richter. An exemplar is a graduate of the Academy who has gone on to extraordinary accomplishments during his or her military career. Richter, who graduated on June 3, 1964, was an accomplished fighter pilot during the Vietnam War. At the age of 23, he was the youngest pilot in that conflict to shoot down a Mikoyan, commonly referred to as a MiG, in air-to-air combat. At the time of his death, July 28, 1967, First Lieutenant Richter had flown 198 missions over North Vietnam – more missions than any other airman at that time. A statue of First Lieutenant Richter is being dedicated at the Academy's Hall of Heroes during graduation week.

There are 12 international cadets graduating on Wednesday; they represent Colombia, Ecuador, Jamaica, Korea, Pakistan, Peru, the Philippines, Singapore, Suriname, Tunisia, Taiwan, and Thailand.

In the Class of 2008, eight cadets will be cross-commissioned into other branches of the military (five to the Army and three to the Navy). There are 87 Post Graduate Scholarship/Fellowship Winners.
