Dear Chairman Bush:

I understand from an article in the Washington Post which was reprinted in the <u>Milwaukee Sentinel</u> that the RNC is investigating charges that Karl C. Rove taught "political sabotage and dirty tricks" at a campaign seminar in Wisconsin in August of 1971. I find it incumbent upon me to respond to these charges.

I was the state chairman of the Wisconsin College Republicans in 1971-1972. The Wisconsin College Republicans co-sponsored the seminar in question with the College Republican National Committee. The schedule for the seminar, a copy of which is enclosed, was established by Karl Rove and myself. I therefore believe that I can speak with authority about the allegations made against Karl Rove and the seminar.

As you will note from the schedule, the seminar followed a tight schedule, and it centered around the organization of a statewide youth campaign. No where in the schedule was there any topic on "campaign sabotage and dirty tricks". The only time when this topic may have come up for discussion was under "Youth Campaign Security", when the discussion would have involved how to prevent your own campaign from being sabotaged rather than how to sabotage your opponent's campaign. In this context, it is possible that Karl may have given examples of campaign sabotage, but only in a negative sense, and not in any way to instruct or encourage the seminar participants to engage in campaign sabotage.

To confirm that my recollection of the seminar is correct, I have been checking with other College Republicans from Wisconsin who attended the seminar. No one with whom I have talked has any memory of Karl Rove, or anyone else, teaching or encouraging either campaign sabotage or dirty tricks in the manner suggested in the newspaper article. I have asked these individuals to send statements regarding their recollection of the seminar, and especially any discussion of campaign sabotage, to your office.

If your office wants to continue the investigation, I will be glad to treate put together a list of the names and addresses of the CRs who registered for the seminar. (Some have graduated from college or are notionger active, but in these cases we could probably supply their home addresses.)

George C. Rand and Mark Freedman were at the hotel where this seminar was held, but to the best of my knowledge, and that of the other seminar participants, they spent most of their time in their room(s) partying, and attended few, if any, of the seminar sessions. It is my personal

opinion that their unfounded charges are based on nothing more than political and/or personal opposition to Karl Rove and their desire to destroy him. It is unfortunate indeed that in attempting to capitalize on the emotion-laden Watergate atmosphere, Messrs Rand and Freedman have evidently given little regard to how their tactics may damage the Republican Party. If anyone deserves reprimanding, it is George C. Rand and Mark Freedman, and not Karl Rove.

Having worked with Karl Rove throughout my term as Chairman of the Wisconsin College Republicans, I can attest that Karl is an intelligent hard-working and mature individual whose activities have always been positive in nature, and a credit to our party. I believe he is a real asset to the College Republican National Committee and to the Republica National Committee, and it will indeed be a shame if the "sour grapes" antics of Rand and Freedman should in any way injure Karl's effective-: ness.

In a recent article in the <u>Milwaukee Journal</u> I read that George Rand and Mark Freedman have accused Karl Rove of teaching dirty tricks at a workshop in Wisconsin in August of 1971. At the time of this workshop I was state vice chairman of the Wisconsin College Republicans which sponsored this workshop along with the College Republican National Committee. J. Timothy Gratz who was state chairman at that time, and myself, did most of the work of getting people to attend this workshop and raising money to pay formit.

I attended most of the sessions of the workshop including the one on campaign security. At this session Karl Rove talked about dirty tricks that have been pulled on various campaigns. The tenor of Mr. Rove's talk was how to avoid having these tricks pulled on yourself during a campaign. His opinion was that these tricks could backfire too easily and that time and effort put into most dirty tricks could be better used in other ways.

Mr. Rove's opinion of dirty tricks was not shared by all those participating in these workshops. I also attended a workshop conducted by Morton Blackwell in February of 1970. At this workshop Blackwell did advocate the use of dirty tricks. He was suggesting things such as planting embarrassing questions at a press conference or hecklers at a speech.

My opinion is that the charges against Mr. Bove are false and are an attempt to discredit Rove so that the Republican National Committee will not recognize Rove as CENC Chairman.

I have the highest opinion of Karl Rove and I am sure he will make a very outstanding CRNC Chairman.

As a delegate to the August 11,12,13, 1972 Fieldman School in Lexington, Kentucky, I believe I may be of some service to you in regard to the investigation concerning Mr. Karl C. Rove.

The three day seminar in question was a well organized workshop in practical politics. During the course of the workshop those present were trained to raise funds, organize a youth campaign, compose press releases, design a news-letter and other similar nutsand-bolts endeavors.

Concerning tactics, they were of the nature of rye-grass signs along highways; washing windshields and leaving a note which said something on the order of "Now that you can see clearly, please vote for...." And other harmless publicity stunts.

On occasion, to relieve the tension produced by the high intensity of this crash course in basic campaign planning, Mr. Rove told amusing stories. One of these concerned a fellow who invited 1,000 hippie types to the opening of the Dixon campaign headquaters. No one identified the culprit in this case and Mr. Rove certainly did not take credit for the incident.

Such stories must be taken in the context of the campaign school. They were never advocated. I specifically recall Mr. Rove warning those in his audience who would consider using such tactics, "I can't stop you if you want to do that but you should be extremely careful if you do."

Dear Mr. Bush,

Enclosed you will find a copy of a newspaper article which appeared in the <u>Milwaukee</u> <u>Sentinel</u>. I am writing you this letter to discuss the subject matter which appears in said article.

Having participated in the 1971 Wisconsin College Republican Leadership Training School I was distressed to read that Karl Rove has been accused of giving talks on campaign espionage. To the best of my recollection Mr. Rove gave no lectures at any time regarding methods of political sabotage. Mr. Rove's presentations at the Wisconsin seminar dealt specifically on how to establish College Republican clubs and how to set up campaign organizations.

Mr. Rove did mention that security was a visal aspect of any campaign apparatus and did in passing mention a few incidents that all campaign staffs should watch out for in protecting themselves from possible infiltration by one's opponent.

Er. Rove related a story, for example, where a youth volunteer for a Republican candidate stumbled by accident into the offices of the Democratic opponent one evening. It seems that both the Republican and Democratic candidates had campaign offices located in the same building and that the Republication volunteer pushed the wrong button in the elevator and found himself on the Democrat's floor. Next to the office door were the evenings trash collection wrapped up in plastic jags and the Republican volunteer took them back to his office. While sorting through the trash the volunteer found a sheet of paper listing the names of persons who had contributed to the Democrate campaign. It furned out that one name on the list belonged to a gentleman who had also contributed to the Republican candidate. In fact the individual had contributed more money to the Democrat this to the Republican and Mr. Rove said that the Republican candidate had the contribution returned

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to the individual. The point of the story, I believe, was to be careful as to what you leave aroung a campaign headquatter.

There were a few stories of this nature told by Mr. Rove at the Wisconsin seminar. I do not remember them being part of his formal presentations rather they came up in the question and answer period. There nature was not how to sabotage one's political opponent's campaign but things one should watch out for in an attempt to provide security in one's own political campaign.

In closing I would like to state that I believe the charges made by Mr. Rand and Mr. Freedman are unfounded. I feel that this incident is an attempt to use the hysteria of Watergate to affect the outcome of an election for CRNC Chairman. I am quite distressed to find my fellow Republicans using Watergate to promote their own political ends.

A person who is loyal to our party and who has dedicated so much time and effort to promote College Republican clubs on the Nation's campuses has been unjustly accused of wrongdoings. GOP Reopens Probe of 'Dirty Tricks'

Washington Post Special Washington, D. C .- Republican National Chairman George Bush has reopened an investigation into allegations that a paid official of the party laught political sabotage and "dirly tricks" during weekend seminars for college Republicans, including one in Wisconsin in August, 1971.

Two affidavits submitted to the Republican National Committee charged that Karl C. Rove 22, who was executive director of the College Republican National Committee (CRNC), an affiliate of the GOP, from June, 1971, to February, 1972, gave a talk on campaign espionage at a Wisconsul seminal.

The notarized statements were submitted by George C. Rand, of Cleveland, and Mark S. Freedman, of Chicago, both members of the college Republican group.

Rand, chairman of the Ohio National Conege Republicans, sall in a telephone interview: "He didn't specifically say it was a good idea but the results



were what they wanted - to discredit and emborrass the candidate of the onnosition. One of the reasons I didn't support him is the kind of thing he talked about in Wisconsin."

Rove was in Milwaukee on Aug. 30, 1971. On that date he discussed GOP cam-DUS voter registration at a press conference held at the Downtowner Motor Inn. At the time he was national director of Project: Open Door, a CRNC program to attract college students to the Darty.]

Freedman, who worked as a part time employe of the CRNC last year while attending American University In Washington, said of Rove:

"They were paying his expenses and ne was paid to teach campaign sabotage. He was proud of his abilities."

Bush said he will urge a committee to "get to the bottom" of charges against Rove.

Bush, who frequently has voiced a determination to keep the GOP free of any Watergale taint, reopened the investigation after the Washington Post

Dear Chairman Bush:

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Ithess come to my attention that, in an article in the <u>Washington Post</u> of August 10, 1973, Mr. Karl Rove is accused of teaching "dirty tricks" in the student Fieldman schools he ran as Executive Director of the College Republican National Committee. I attended one of these schools (at New York University in July, 1972), was present at another (at Harvard University in March, 1973), and have talked with several students who have attended other Fieldman schools. I would like to shed what light I can on the charges in the Post article.

It is true that Mr. Rove, in these Fieldman schools, did tell stories about various campaigns he has worked on -I remember one story which is essentially the story of the infiltrator into the Dixon campaign as reported by the <u>Post</u>, and several others. The primary purpose of these stories was, as far as I could tell, to enliven the long, intensive political seminars. Although I remember no seplicit warning not to imitate the actions described, there is no question in my mind that these stories were not intended to encourage the questionable type of activities they portrayed. This interpretation is indicated by the fact that my notes for the course contain no references whatsoever to the stories, but do contain at least two explicit warnings not to engage in illegal or immoral activities in campaigns.

The appropriateness of such stories, which could be subject to misinterpretation, in a training program for campaigners may be questioned, particularly in these days when politicians, like Caesar's wife, must be above even the slightest appearance of impropriety. However, there is no question in my mind that the charges in the <u>Post</u> article are based on evidence taken out of context and greatly exaggerated.

However, at three of them (Harvard, American University and Richmond, Virginia) I was only present for a few hours to give a speech on the state legislative race of Senator Roy M. Goodman of New York, for whom I was campaign manager. Therefore, my information in those cases is not based on extensive attendance.

The only school at which I attended all of the sessions was the New York University Fieldman School held in New York City last summer. I was attending as a student, and as Vice Chairman of the New York State College Republicans. During the course of this school, Karl Rove and others spoke on many issues, primarily how to run a "youth for" campaign and how to organize a campus College Republican club I do not recall any instance at this school, or during my limited attendance at the others, at which I heard Karl Rove encourage what could be construed as "dirty tricks."

Since 1971, I have attended approximately six campaign schools sponsored by the College Republican National Committee. At each one of these schools, Karl Rove was directly involved, either as Executive Director of the C.R.N.C. or as a major participant during the time I was Executive Director from February through June of this year.

Most of the schools had much the same format, covering nuts and bolts subjects needed for those who were interested in helping to mobilize support for Republican candidates for office on college campuses.

At a number of these schools, an anecdote was told concerning an incident during the Republican U.S. Senate campaign in Illinois in 1970 where somebody used the name of "Roy Thompson" to work in the opposition headquarters and in fact attempted to sabotage the opening of x one of the opposition's headquarters by passing out flyers in skid row neighborhoods inviting the derelicts to a party. /

This story, which became known as the "Roy Thompson story", was told in a very humerous vain and in the context of an activity not to be engaged in should those attending the school work in a future campaign.

To suggest that either this anecdote was used as a serious effort to engage of recruit Campus epublicans in campaign espionage or that any of these student campaign schools were used to advocate this type of activity would normally be merely laughable. Bush's *Clear Skies* for Coal: The Best Case Scenario

Summary: Utilities with coal-fired plant in their portfolios supply half of the nation's electric power and face a variety of upcoming Clean Air Act requirements that are shaping their capital expenditure rates and the general economics of generation fleets.

A December 2000 decision to regulate mercury as a hazardous air pollutant has been a key driver in accelerating industry's efforts to consolidate various Clean Air Act requirements into a "multipollutant" strategy. The Department of Energy estimates nonmercury-related capital expenditures to be \$5-9 billion over the next decade, with mercury representing an additional \$1.7-5 billion.

In this report, we identify the Bush Administration's *Clear Skies Initiative*, a three-pollutant plan, as the best-case scenario for coalfired utilities. *Clear Skies* has been proposed as legislation this session, but we believe that the real action will occur in the 108th Congress set to convene in January 2003, after this fall's elections. The other alternatives — Congress enacting a stricter multipollutant program or the Environmental Protection Agency implementing the Clean Air Act as it stands and adding maximum achievable control technology requirements for mercury — both pose significantly higher compliance costs to coal-fired capacity owners in our analysis.

Further, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's recently proposed Standard Market Design rule has interesting implications for coal-fired asset viability as the ability of an owner to limit transmission access and protect less efficient generation assets looks set to decline. We see improved transmission access for newer, more efficient, cleaner-burning plants as finally reintroducing to the generation market the economic drivers that were assumed in the passage of the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments, but that were derailed by the 1992 Energy Policy Act and its implementation.

A group of shareholders that includes the Connecticut treasurer's office and several religious organizations have begun a campaign to compel the largest electric utilities in the nation to publish information about liabilities they might face because of their emission of gases that contribute to global warming.

Led by the State of Connecticut Plans and Trust Fund and members of the New York-based Interfaith Center on Corporate Responsibility, the shareholder coalition has filed resolutions to be voted upon at the annual meetings later this year of American Electric Power, the Southern Company, Xcel Energy Inc., the TXU and the Cinergy Corporation (sic).

The shareholders contend that there are hidden risks at the large power companies because of their release of carbon dioxide, which is widely thought to be linked to global warming, and the pollutants sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxide and mercury. They contend that companies could face risks if emissions of carbon dioxide were regulated and limited, which many environmentalists and some power companies think is inevitable. They also assert that the electric utilities may have to grapple with litigation linked to the emissions.

"In American Electric Power's own disclosure to the S.E.C., they acknowledge climate change as a risk factor," said Denise L. Nappier, the Connecticut treasurer. "What they haven't done, and what most utility companies haven't done, so far, is present to their shareholders a comprehensive assessment of these risks and how they plan to address them."

American Electric Power, the nation's largest utility, has filed a letter seeking no action against it from the Securities and Exchange Commission if it chooses not to include the shareholder resolution in the proxy statement for its annual meeting. A company spokeswoman said that American Electric Power already provided the kind of information the shareholders seek, and accused them of seeking to stop the burning of fossil fuels for electricity generation.

But the investors contend that they seek disclosure of information rather than a radical change in business practices.

This Nation was founded upon the belief that every human being is endowed by our Creator with certain "unalienable rights." Chief among them is the right to life itself. The Signers of the Declaration of Independence pledged their own lives, fortunes, and honor to guarantee inalienable rights for all of the new country's citizens. These visionaries recognized that an essential human dignity attached to all persons by virtue of their very existence and not just to the strong, the independent, or the healthy. That value should apply to every American, including the elderly and the unprotected, the weak and the infirm, and even to the unwanted.

Thomas Jefferson wrote that, "[t]he care of human life and happiness and not their destruction is the first and only legitimate object of good government." President Jefferson was right. Life is an inalienable right, understood as given to each of us by our Creator.

President Jéfferson's timeless principle obligates us to pursue a civil society that will democratically embrace its essential moral duties, including defending the elderly, strengthening the weak, protecting the defenseless, feeding the hungry, and caring for children -- born and unborn. Mindful of these and other obligations, we should join together in pursuit of a more compassionate society, rejecting the notion that some lives are less worthy of protection than others, whether because of age or illness, social circumstance or economic condition. Consistent with the core principles about which Thomas Jefferson wrote, and to which the Founders subscribed, we should peacefully commit ourselves to seeking a society that values life -- from its very beginnings to its natural end. HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II: Mr. President, it gives me great pleasure to welcome you on your first visit since you assumed the office of the President of the United States. I warmly greet the distinguished First Lady and the members of your entourage. I express heart-felt good wishes that your presidency will strengthen your country in its commitment to the principles which inspired American democracy from the beginning, and sustained the nation and its remarkable growth. These principles remain as valid as ever as you face the challenges of the new country opening up before us.

Your nation's founders, conscious of the immense natural and human resources with which your land has been blessed by the Creator, were guided by a profound sense of responsibility towards the common good to be pursued in respect for the God-given dignity and inalienable rights of all. America continues to measure herself by the nobility of her founding vision in building this society of liberty, equality and justice under the law. In the century which has just ended, these same ideals inspired the American people to resist two totalitarian systems, based on an atheistic vision of man and society.

At the beginning of this new century, which also marks the beginning of the third millennium of Christianity, the world continues to look to America with hope. And it does so with an acute awareness of the crisis of values being experienced in Western society, ever more insecure in the face of the ethical decisions, indispensable for humanity's future course.

In recent days, the world's attention has been focused on the process of globalization which has so greatly accelerated in the past decade, and which you and other leaders of the industrialized nations have discussed in Genoa. While appreciating the opportunities for economic growth and material prosperity, which this process offers, the Church cannot but express profound concern that our world continues to be divided no longer by the former political and military blocs, but by a tragic fault-line between those who can benefit from these opportunities and those who seem cut off from them.

The revolution of freedom of which I spoke at the United Nations in 1995 must now be completed by a revolution of opportunity, in which all the world's people actively contribute to the economic prosperity and share in its fruits. This requires leadership by those nations whose religious and cultural traditions should make them most attentive to the moral dimension of the issues involved.

Respect for human dignity and belief in the equal dignity of all the members of the human family demand policies aimed at enabling all people to access to the means required to improve their lives, including the technological means and skills needed for development. Respect for nature by everyone, a policy of openness to immigrants, the cancellation or significant reduction of the debt of poorer nations, the promotion of peace through dialogue and negotiation, the primacy of the rule of law; these are the priorities which the leaders of the developed countries cannot disregard. A global world is essentially a world of solidarity. From this point of view, America, because of her many resources, cultural traditions and religious values, has a special responsibility.

Respect for human dignity finds one of its highest expressions in religious freedom. This right is the first listed in your nation's Bill of Rights, and it is significant that the promotion of religious freedom continues to be an important goal of American policy in the international community. I want to express the appreciation of the whole Catholic Church for America's commitment in this regard.

Another area in which political and moral choices have the gravest consequences for the future of civilization concerns the most fundamental of human rights, the right to life itself. Experience is already showing how a tragic coarsening of consciences accompanies the assault on innocent human life in the womb, leading to accommodation and acquiescence in the face of other related evils, such as euthanasia, infanticide, and most recently, proposals for the creation for research purposes of human embryos, destined to destruction in the process.

A free and virtuous society, which America aspires to be, must reject practices that devalue and violate human life at any stage from conception until natural dead. In defending the right to life, in law and through a vibrant culture of life, America can show a world the path to a truly humane future in which man remains the master, not the product of his technology.

Mr. President, as you carry out the tasks of the high office which the American people have entrusted to you, I assure you of a remembrance in my prayers. I am confident that under your leadership, your nation will continue to draw on its heritage and resources to help build a world in which each member of the human family can flourish and live in a manner worthy of his or her innate dignity. With these sentiments, I cordially invoke upon you and the beloved American people, God's blessings of wisdom, strength and peace.

Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT BUSH: Your Holiness, thank you very much. Mrs. Bush and I are honored to stand with you today. We're grateful for your welcome. You've been to America many times, and have spoken to vast crowds. You have met with four American Presidents before me, including my father. In every visit, and in every meeting, including our meeting today, you have reminded America that we have a special calling to promote justice and to defend the weak and suffering of the world. We remember your words, and we will always do our best to remember our calling.

Since October of 1978, you have shown the world not only the splendor of truth, but also the power of truth to overcome evil and to redirect the course of history. You have urged men and women of goodwill to take to their knees before God, and to stand unafraid before tyrants. And this has added greatly to the momentum of freedom in our time.

Where there's oppression, you speak of human rights. Where there's poverty, you speak of justice and hope. Where there's ancient hatred, you defend and display a tolerance that reaches beyond every boundary of race and nation and belief. Where there's great abundance, you remind us that wealth must be matched with compassion and moral purpose. And always, to all, you have carried the gospel of life, which welcomes the stranger and protects the weak and the innocent. Every nation, including my own, benefits from hearing and heeding this message of conscience.

Above all, you have carried the message of the Gospel into 126 nations, and into the third millennium, always with courage, and with confidence. You have brought the love of God into the lives of men, and that good news is needed in every nation, and every age.

Thank you again, your Holiness, for your kindness, and the honor of this meeting.

nce in a while, a piece of postal history brings an individual's life into focus, if only for a brief moment. One such window onto the past came into my possession in the form of a letter about a slave hired out by his master to the Confederate government as a "rough carpenter." The folded letter is franked with a single 5-cent blue Richmond print overpaying the drop letter rate of two cents. Postmarked Danville, Virginia, May 12, 1863, it is addressed to Major W.L. Sutherlin, Quarter Master CSA, Danville, Virginia. The letter reads, in its entirety:

Danville, May 12, 1863. Sir:

I have to request that you will have my negro man "Dabney" returned to duty under Mr. Dudley as a rough Carpenter, he having been originally hired to the Quarter. Master's Department here as such.

In September last he was taken with Small-pox and sent to the Small Pox Hospital, and having recovered he has been retained there as an attendant to this time. I wish him to be taken from there forthwith and put to work as above. I shall leave for Richmond tomorrow morning or I should have seen you in person.

P.S. I would be pleased if you would give Dabney a few days leave of absence in order to visit his wife.

With only his first name to go by, what happened to Dabney following the war probably will never be known. And yet a lifetime of information has been compressed into the few sentences of a wartime letter.

MEMO FOR MR. ROVE'S CONSIDERATION RE: THREE RX DRUG ISSUES

I. MEDICARE RX BENEFIT & THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET PROPOSAL

Our first concern involves the critical issue of delivering on the promise of adding a prescription drug benefit to Medicare and, in particular, the importance of how this is addressed in January in the Administration's Budget proposal to Congress (for FY04).

As you well know, the political and public consensus is strong that it is time to add prescription drugs to the Medicare benefit package. President Bush campaigned in 2000 and 2002 on getting this done and, during the fall debates, virtually all successful Republican vulnerables and challengers promised to deliver a Medicare drug benefit. With the Republicans now in charge of the Senate as well as the House and the White House, a key strategic and tactical change will occur in the Medicare drug debate in 2003. Because Republicans control everything, they will be under tremendous pressure during the next Congress to produce some type of Medicare prescription drug bill. They cannot blame failure on the Democratic Senate.

Substantively, in addition to the level of overall Medicare reform, there are two key questions regarding the drug benefit:

 Will Republicans support a voluntary benefit for <u>all</u> seniors or only for some?
Will Republicans support a private-sector delivery model inside of Medicare or a government-run delivery model?

We strongly believe that the winning strategy for President Bush is to endorse a Medicare drug benefit for ALL seniors that uses a private-sector delivery model inside of Medicare along the lines of the leading House and Senate bills in 2002. The winning approach is built on the bills that passed the House in both 2000 (HR 3680) and 2002 (HR 4954) and that has been the leading proposal in the Senate Finance Committee sponsored by the Tripartisan Group (S. 2729 and S. 4310). We believe that, based on the fact that the House successfully passed this bill in 2000 and 2002, with Reps. Hastert, DeLay, and Thomas driving, they can do so again if the White House is willing to allocate sufficient funds. While Senate Republican Leaders have not been willing to drive a bill to the floor in the past, they all acknowledge that the Tripartisan bill is the leading bill and has more than enough votes to pass out of the Finance Committee (since Chairman Grassley and Senators Hatch, Snowe, Breaux, Jeffords and Frist strongly support it). If the White House is willing to allocate sufficient funds are to help build Senate consensus, then the Senate can likely produce a bill that can be successfully conferenced with the House.

Any such legislation obviously puts significant demands on the federal budget. In 2002, the two leading universally available drug benefit proposals were the House bill at \$320 billion and the Senate Tripartisan bill at \$375 billion. As you are aware, because next year's budget debate will include another year of the Baby Boom cohort with 2013, then an identical benefit becomes incrementally more expensive.

We ask that the President's Proposed FY04 Budget allocate enough money to enable Republicans to successfully position themselves to craft a universal Medicare prescription drug benefit for all seniors in 2003. The alternative, which would be to allocate only enough for a benefit for low-income seniors, will result in opponents characterizing Republicans as denying a meaningful benefit to millions of seniors – in violation of a core tenet of the Medicare program: that everyone eligible for Medicare has always been a universal health security program for all seniors, not a welfare program only for low-income seniors and that the Republicans were fundamentally changing the nature of the Medicare entitlement.

II. MEDICAID DRUG PRICING & THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET PROPOSAL

The second issue, the Medicaid program, also involves the upcoming Administration Budget proposal.

By and large, we have a free-market pricing system for drugs in the United States. One notable exception is in the Medicaid program for the poorest. Unfortunately, the Medicaid program controls prices and requires that manufacturers provide a mandatory rebate to the Federal government for every drug sold to a Medicaid recipient. We got a very big shock last year when OMB included a very hostile provision in the Administration's Budget proposal (for fiscal year 2003) that proposed to change the way the Medicaid rebate is calculated. The result of the OMB proposal contained in the President's Budget would be to extract substantially larger mandatory rebates from pharmaceutical companies. We immediately confirmed that this change was made solely to generate larger rebates and therefore Medicaid savings for the Federal government. According to government economists, the proposal would reduce pharmaceutical sales by \$31 billion. The Democrats took advantage of the OMB proposal to attack House Republicans and no one wants to go through that again.

We ask you to intervene and request that OMB not include this Medicaid rebate proposal or any other "surprise attacks" involving Medicaid pricing in the President's upcoming budget proposal.

III. DOMESTIC DRUG PATENTS (A.K.A. "REFORMING THE HATCH-WAXMAN ACT")

Last year, Senators McCain, Schumer, and Edwards teamed up to attack the brand name pharmaceutical industry for "gaming" drug patents to frustrate generic competition (S. 812). S. 812 passed the Senate in July; the House refused to take it up. PhRMA was preparing for the 2003 legislative debate on this issue when President Bush held an October 21 White House Rose Garden ceremony to announce a proposed FDA drug patent regulation to correct such "gaming." Any objective analysis of the October 21 regulation would agree with President Bush's statement that it strongly addresses the "gaming" of drug patents. To that end, while we will work to improve the proposed regulation through the FDA rulemaking process, and we are working to unify Congressional Republicans behind the President's action and to therefore oppose the McCain-Schumer-Edwards legislation in 2003.

PhRMA strongly believes that the President's move to address drug patents and the related Hatch-Waxman Act "gaming" issues through regulation and the stated intention of the Administration that this move was designed to avoid legislation has changed the picture. This has been reinforced in multiple conversations at the highest levels of the Administration, including with Deputy WH CoS Josh Bolton, FDA General Counsel Dan Troy, and just last week with new FDA Commissioner Mark McClellan, who all told us that they are focused on making the regulation process work and to have it serve as a victory for the President. The alternative is to give a victory to John Edwards and Chuck Schumer, putting aside Senator McCain.

We are asking that, given the hard-hitting new FDA rule, the White House help us – behind the scenes, if necessary – avoid legislation in this area. <u>Specifically, we</u> are asking for your help in unifying key Congressional Republicans behind the <u>President's choice to issue this regulation in order to avoid legislation</u>. We hope you will call Senators Gregg, Frist and Hatch, and Congressman Tauzin. (Suggested message: "I hope you will support the President's proposed FDA rule and avoid any legislation in this area in the new Congress,")

N. Gregory Mankiw is Professor of Economics at Harvard University. As a student, he studied economics at Princeton University and MIT. As a teacher, he has taught macroeconomics, microeconomics, statistics, and principles of economics. He even spent one summer long ago as a sailing instructor on Long Beach Island.

Professor Mankiw is a prolific writer and a regular participant in academic and policy debates. His research includes work on price adjustment, consumer behavior, financial markets, monetary and fiscal policy, and economic growth. His published articles have appeared in academic journals, such as the American Economic Review, Journal of Political Economy, and Quarterly Journal of Economics, and in more widely accessible forums, such as The New York Times, The Financial Times, The Wall Street Journal, and Fortune.

He has written two popular textbooks--the intermediate-level textbook "Macroeconomics" (Worth Publishers) and the introductory textbook "Principles of Economics" (South-Western/Thomson). Together, these two books have sold about a million copies and have been translated into seventeen languages.

In addition to his teaching, research, and writing, Professor Mankiw is a research associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research, an adviser to the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston and the Congressional Budget Office, and a member of the ETS test development committee for the advanced placement exam in economics.

Professor Mankiw lives in Wellesley, Massachusetts, with his wife and three children.
