Radio Address March 8, 2003 Draft #5

Good morning.

This has been an important week on two fronts of our war against terror. First, American and Pakistani authorities captured the mastermind of the September 11th attacks against our country, Khalid Shaikh Mohammed. This is a landmark achievement in disrupting the al-Qaida network and we believe it will help us prevent future acts of terror. We are currently working with over 90 countries and have dealt with over 3,000 terrorists – who have been detained, arrested, or otherwise will not be a problem for the United States.

Second, the chief United Nations weapons inspector reported yesterday to the Security Council on his efforts to verify Saddam Hussein's compliance with Resolution 1441. This resolution requires Iraq to fully and unconditionally disarm itself of nuclear, chemical, and biological weapons materials, as well as the prohibited missiles that could be used to deliver them. Unfortunately, it is clear that Saddam Hussein is still violating the demands of the United Nations by refusing to disarm.

Iraq's dictator has made a public show of producing and destroying a few prohibited missiles. Yet our intelligence shows that even as he is destroying these few missiles, he has ordered the continued production of the very same type of missiles. Iraqi operatives continue to play a shell game with inspectors, moving suspected prohibited materials to different locations every 12 to 24 hours. And Iraqi weapons scientists continue to be threatened with harm should they cooperate in interviews with UN inspectors.

These are not the actions of a regime that is disarming. These are the actions of a regime engaged in a willful charade. If the Iraqi regime were disarming, we would know it, because we would see it. Iraq's weapons would be presented to inspectors and destroyed. Inspection teams do not need more time, or more personnel – all they need is what they have never received: the full cooperation of the Iraqi regime. The only acceptable outcome is the outcome already demanded by a unanimous vote of the Security Council: total disarmament.

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Saddam Hussein has a long history of reckless aggression and terrible crimes. He possesses weapons of terror. He provides funding, and training, and safe haven to terrorists - who would willingly deliver weapons of mass destruction against America and other peace loving countries.

The attacks of September 11, 2001 showed what the enemies of America did with four airplanes. We will not wait to see what terrorists or terror states could do with weapons of mass destruction. We are determined to confront threats wherever they arise. And, as a last resort, we must be willing to use military force. We are doing everything we can to avoid war in Iraq. But if Saddam Hussein does not disarm peacefully, he will be disarmed by force.

Across the world, and in every part of America, people of good will are hoping and praying for peace. Our goal is peace - for our own Nation. for our friends and allies, and for all the peoples of the Middle East. People of good will must also recognize that allowing a dangerous dictator to defy the world and build an arsenal for conquest and mass murder is not peace at all; it is pretense. The cause of peace will be advanced only when the terrorists lose a wealthy patron and protector ... and when the dictator is fully and finally disarmed.

I. PURPOSE

To visit with the immediate family members of those lost aboard Space Shuttle *Columbia* on February 1, 2003.

II. BACKGROUND

On February 4, 2003, you attended a memorial service at Johnson Space Center in Houston honoring the seven crew members killed aboard Space Shuttle *Columbia*. After the memorial service, you visited privately with family members of the crew. During this visit, you invited the families to visit the White House the next time they would be in Washington.

Family members of all seven astronauts will be in Washington over the next few days to attend funerals for those crew members being buried at Arlington National Cemetery (Commander Laurel Clark, Captain David Brown, and Lieutenant Colonel Michael Anderson). The families will be coming to the White House directly from the funeral service for Lieutenant Colonel Anderson.

The families will be escorted to the White House by Casualty Assistance Calls Officers (CACOs). These members of the astronaut corps were selected by the families prior to the mission and have been with them continuously since February 1. The CACOs have been critical to the emotional and logistical support of the Columbia families.
