

Radio Address March 15, 2003 Draft #8

Good morning.

This weekend marks a bitter anniversary for the people of Iraq. Fifteen years ago, Saddam Hussein's regime ordered a chemical weapons attack on a village in Iraq called Halabja [hah-LAHB-jah]. With that single order, the regime killed thousands of Iraq's Kurdish citizens. Whole families died while trying to flee clouds of nerve and mustard agents descending from the sky. Many who managed to survive still suffer from cancer, blindness, respiratory diseases, miscarriages, and severe birth defects among their children. The chemical attack on Halabja [hah-LAHB-jah] – just one of 40 targeted at Iraq's own people – provided a glimpse of the crimes Saddam Hussein is willing to commit, and the kind of threat he now presents to the entire world. He is among history's cruelest dictators, and he is arming himself with the world's most terrible weapons.

Recognizing this threat, the United Nations Security Council has demanded that Saddam Hussein give up all his weapons of mass destruction as a condition for ending the Gulf War 12 years ago. The Security Council has repeated this demand numerous times and warned that Iraq faces serious consequences if it fails to comply. Iraq has responded with defiance, delay, and deception.

The United States, Great Britain, and Spain continue to work with fellow members of the UN Security Council to confront this common danger. We have seen far too many instances in the past decade – from Bosnia, to Rwanda, to Kosovo – where the failure of the Security Council to act decisively has led to tragedy. And we must recognize that some threats are so grave – and their potential consequences so terrible – that they must be removed, even if it requires military force.

As diplomatic efforts continue, we must never lose sight of the basic facts about the regime in Baghdad.

We know from recent history that Saddam Hussein is a reckless dictator who has twice invaded his neighbors without provocation – wars that led to death and suffering on a massive scale.

We know from human rights groups that dissidents in Iraq are tortured, imprisoned, and sometimes just disappear. Their hands, feet, or tongues are cut off, their eyes are gouged out, and female relatives are raped in their presence. As the Nobel laureate and Holocaust survivor Elie Wiesel [ELL-ee VEE-zell] said this week, "We have a moral obligation to intervene where evil is in control. Today, that place is Iraq."

We know from prior weapons inspections that Saddam has failed to account for vast quantities of biological and chemical agents, including mustard agent, botulinum toxin, and sarin capable of killing millions of people. We know that the Iraqi regime finances and sponsors terror. And we know the regime has plans to place innocent people around military installations to act as human shields.

There is little reason to hope that Saddam Hussein will disarm. If force is required to disarm him, the American people can know that our Armed Forces have been given every tool and every resource to achieve victory. The people of Iraq can know that every effort will be made to spare innocent life – and to help Iraq recover from three decades of totalitarian rule. And plans are in place to provide Iraqis with massive amounts of food, as well as medicine and other essential supplies, in the event of hostilities.

Crucial days lie ahead for the free nations of the world.

Governments are now showing whether their stated commitments to liberty and security are words alone – or convictions they are prepared to act upon. As for the government of the United States, and the coalition we lead, there is no doubt: We will confront a growing danger, to protect ourselves, to remove a patron and protector of terror, and to keep the peace of the world.

Dr. Katrin Michael is a Chaldean (Christian) from Northern Iraq. She joined the Kurdish-based Iraqi resistance movement in 1982 to fight against Saddam Hussein's regime. A victim of chemical bombings by Saddam's forces, she fled Iraq in 1988. She has been living in the United States since 1997, where she is a leading advocate on behalf of Iraqis persecuted by Saddam's regime.

Background: Sam lives with his family in Fort Collins, Colorado. He is diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis (CF) and Short Gut Syndrome. The only visible sign of Sam's illness is his size; he is just under four feet tall and weighs 61 pounds. His cognitive functions are normal.

You are his role model for being strong-hearted, righteous, and honorable.

Sam loves to spend time with his family, bowl, play football, and play video games. He has a dog named Mariah and a cat named Itty. He enjoys reading; his favorite author is Frank Peretti.

Sam will present you with an engraved calfskin bible with a personal note inside. He will present Mrs. Bush with a scarf.

Note: Sam turned 13 on March 9, 2003; you sent him a birthday greeting.

#### Cystic Fibrosis (CF)

CF is a genetic disease that causes the body to produce abnormally thick, sticky mucus. The mucus obstructs the work of the respiratory, digestive, and reproductive systems. CF is a life-shortening disease; the median life expectancy for a person with CF is 32.

#### Short Gut Syndrome

Short Gut Syndrome is a condition involving an anatomic or functional loss of more than 70 percent of the patient's small intestine. Due to this loss, the patient lacks the ability to get proper nutrition. Sam's small size is a result of this improper nutrition. Two years ago, he began "parental nutrition therapy," which is the use of a feeding tube for proper nutrition. He receives two to

three supplemental feedings at night that give him essential calories and nutrients to stimulate growth. Before the development of total parental nutrition therapy, short gut syndrome was lethal.

Starlight Children's Foundation

Similar to Make-A-Wish Foundation, the Starlight Children's Foundation works to enrich the lives of children with life-threatening illnesses through its wish-granting work.
