System of Arrangement

The materials in FOIA 2021-0013-F are a systematic body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

Records responsive to this FOIA were found in these collection areas – George W. Bush Presidential Electronic Records.

The Executive Office of the President (EOP) instance of the Electronic Records Archive (ERA) contains electronic records created or received by President George W. Bush. These records are stored in Search and Access Sets (SAS) that represent their originating computer program, such as Exchange Email or the Worker and Visitor Entry System (WAVES). In addition to records captured from the White House’s electronic systems, EOP-ERA also contains records from the home and shared drives used by White House staff.

The following is a list of electronic search results lists (SRLs) processed in response to FOIA 2021-0013-F:

George W. Bush Electronic Records

ARMS contains 8 assets, all of which are released in full.

Exchange contains 6 assets, all of which are released in full.

WHO contains 5 assets, of which 3 are released in full, 0 are withheld in part, and 2 are withheld in full.
