Scope and Content

The materials in FOIA 2016-0074-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

FOIA 2016-0074-F requested materials related to Michael W. Miller's files relating to the genocide in the Darfur region of Sudan and his role as an advisor to the President's Special Envoy for Sudan, John Danforth.

This FOIA primarily contains reports and papers from governmental and non-governmental organizations, correspondence with scholars and non-governmental organizations about Sudan, draft speeches, draft testimony and correspondence about Congressional testimony, draft

editorials, articles and press reviews, press releases, correspondence related to the International Emergency Economic Powers Act, draft letters to members of Congress, proposed guest lists for meetings, travel requests for overseas trips by John Danforth, documents related to a cease-fire agreement in the Nuba Mountains, invitations to Sudan-related events, USAID budget requests, John Danforth's final Report to the President, and draft Statements by the President. Records present related to the Sudan Peace Act include the text of the act, a draft Statement of Administration Policy, internal administration analysis and commentary, talking points, and plans for the signing ceremony.

Please note that a portion of classified records related to this request has not yet been processed. Additional records will be provided as they become available.

System of Arrangement

The materials in FOIA 2016-0074-F are a systematic body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

Records responsive to this FOIA were found in these collection areas – George W. Bush Presidential Electronic Records.

The Executive Office of the President (EOP) instance of the Electronic Records Archive (ERA) contains electronic records created or received by President George W. Bush. These records are stored in Search and Access Sets (SAS) that represent their originating computer program, such as Exchange Email or the Worker and Visitor Entry System (WAVES). In addition to records captured from the White House's electronic systems, EOP-ERA also contains records from the home and shared drives used by White House staff.

ARMS From contains 331 assets, of which 158 are released in full, 64 are withheld in part, and 109 are withheld in full.

ARMS To contains 598 assets, of which 227 are released in full, 217 are withheld in part, and 154 are withheld in full.
