Scope and Content

The materials in FOIA 2019-0163-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

FOIA 2019-0163-F requested records to or from any White House, Treasury Department, Congressional, or Federal Reserve email addresses mentioning Elizabeth Warren between January 1, 2008 and January 20, 2009.

This FOIA primarily contains news articles and clips quoting Elizabeth Warren in her role as Harvard Law School professor and expert in the field of debt, credit, lending, and bankruptcy; Congressional agendas where Elizabeth Warren served as a witness; speaking event invitations; emails regarding the Congressional Oversight Panel on the Troubled Asset Relief Program

(TARP), of which Elizabeth Warren was the chairperson; and healthcare plans citing a 2005 paper on bankruptcy co-authored by Elizabeth Warren.

System of Arrangement

The materials in FOIA 2019-0163-F are a systematic body of records responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult an archivist about related materials.

Records responsive to this FOIA were found in these collection areas – George W. Bush Presidential Electronic Records.

The Executive Office of the President (EOP) instance of the Electronic Records Archive (ERA) contains electronic records created or received by President George W. Bush. These records are stored in Search and Access Sets (SAS) that represent their originating computer program, such as Exchange Email or the Worker and Visitor Entry System (WAVES). In addition to records captured from the White House's electronic systems, EOP-ERA also contains records from the home and shared drives used by White House staff.
